AN ACT

To require a threat assessment on current foreign terrorist fighter activities, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 2 This Act may be cited as the "Post-Caliphate Threat
- 3 Assessment Act of 2017".
- 4 SEC. 2. THREAT ASSESSMENT.
- 5 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Homeland Secu-
- 6 rity, in coordination with the Secretary of State and Direc-
- 7 tor of National Intelligence, shall conduct a threat assess-
- 8 ment of current foreign terrorist fighter activities. Such
- 9 assessment shall include the following:
- 10 (1) A detailed summary of current foreign ter-
- 11 rorist fighter travel and trends, including countries
- of origin, travel destinations, and means of travel.
- 13 (2) An analysis of any country or region with
- a significant increase in foreign terrorist fighter ac-
- tivity.
- 16 (3) An analysis of foreign terrorist fighter trav-
- 17 el trends in and out of Iraq and Syria.
- 18 (b) Congressional Communication.—Not later
- 19 than 180 days after the date of the enactment of this Act,
- 20 the Secretary of Homeland Security shall report to the
- 21 Committee on Homeland Security, the Committee on For-
- 22 eign Affairs, and the Permanent Select Committee on In-
- 23 telligence of the House of Representatives and the Com-
- 24 mittee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs,
- 25 the Committee on Foreign Relations, and the Select Com-

- 1 mittee on Intelligence of the Senate on the threat assess-
- 2 ment required under subsection (a).
