AN ACT

To amend the Homeland Security Act of 2002 to authorize expenditures to combat emerging terrorist threats, including vehicular attacks, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Shielding Public
3 Spaces from Vehicular Terrorism Act”.

4 **SEC. 2. RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT.**

5 The Homeland Security Act of 2002 is amended—

6 (1) in paragraph (11) of section 302 (6 U.S.C.
7 182), by inserting “research and development to
8 combat emerging terrorist threats, such as vehicular
9 attacks, and” before “the long-term”; and

10 (2) in subparagraph (B) of section 308(b)(2) (6
11 U.S.C. 188(b)(2))—

12 (A) in the matter preceding clause (i), by
13 striking “expertise in—” and inserting “exper-
14 tise in the following:”;

15 (B) by redesignating clause (xiv) as clause
16 (xv); and

17 (C) by inserting after clause (xiii) the fol-
18 lowing new clause:

19 “(xiv) Combating emerging terrorist
20 threats, including vehicular attacks.”.

21 **SEC. 3. ALLOWABLE USES.**

22 Section 2008 of the Homeland Security Act of 2002
23 (6 U.S.C. 609) is amended—

24 (1) in subsection (a)—

1 (A) by redesignating paragraphs (11)
2 through (14) as paragraphs (12) through (15),
3 respectively; and

4 (B) by inserting after paragraph (10) the
5 following new paragraph:

6 “(11) addressing security vulnerabilities of pub-
7 lic spaces, including through the installation of
8 bollards and other target hardening activities;”; and

9 (2) in subsection (b)—

10 (A) in paragraph (3)(B), by striking
11 “(a)(10)” and inserting “(a)(12)”; and

12 (B) by adding at the end the following new
13 paragraph:

14 “(6) FIREARMS.—

15 “(A) IN GENERAL.—A grant awarded
16 under section 2003 or 2004 may not be used
17 for the provision to any person of a firearm or
18 training in the use of a firearm.

19 “(B) NO EFFECT ON OTHER LAWS.—Noth-
20 ing in this paragraph may be construed to pre-
21 clude or contradict any other provision of law
22 authorizing the provision of firearms or training
23 in the use of firearms.”.

1 SEC. 4. REPORT.

2 The Secretary of Homeland Security shall submit to
3 the Committee on Homeland Security of the House of
4 Representatives and the Committee on Homeland Security
5 and Governmental Affairs of the Senate a report on poten-
6 tial terrorism vulnerabilities relating to emerging auto-
7 motive technologies that support driverless vehicles and
8 the associated threat such vehicles may pose to people in
9 public spaces. Such report shall also compare any public
10 benefit of such vehicles against any such vulnerabilities
11 and threats.
