## A BILL

To repeal the multi-State plan program.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Repeal Insurance
- 5 Plans of the Multi-State Program Act of 2017" or the
- 6 "RIP MSP Act".
- 7 SEC. 2. REPEAL OF MULTI-STATE PLAN PROGRAM.
- 8 (a) Definitions.—In this section, the terms "multi-
- 9 State plan issuer" and "MSP issuer" mean a health insur-
- 10 ance issuer or group of health insurance issuers that has

- 1 a contract with the Office of Personnel Management to
- 2 offer multi-State plan options pursuant to section 1334
- 3 of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (Public
- 4 Law 111–148).
- 5 (b) Program Repeal.—Effective October 1, 2018,
- 6 section 1334 of the Patient Protection and Affordable
- 7 Care Act (Public Law 111–148) shall have no force or
- 8 effect.
- 9 (c) REQUIRED REPORTING.—Not later than 60 days
- 10 after the date of enactment of this Act, the Director of
- 11 the Office of Personnel Management shall provide the
- 12 Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Af-
- 13 fairs of the Senate and the Committee on Oversight and
- 14 Government Reform of the House of Representatives a
- 15 briefing concerning the efforts of the Office of Personnel
- 16 Management (referred to in this section as "OPM") to
- 17 wind down the multi-State program under section 1334
- 18 of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act. Such
- 19 briefing shall contain such information as may be re-
- 20 quired, including information regarding—
- 21 (1) the methods of communication OPM and an
- MSP issuer will use to notify current enrollees that
- the multi-State plan will not be offered during the
- 24 next open season, including a timeline of the planned
- communications;

- 1 (2) a description of how the Director of OPM
  2 will work with the Secretary of Health and Human
  3 Services to ensure that no plans previously offered
  4 pursuant to such section 1334 are offered on State
  5 or Federal Exchanges; and
- 6 (3) a timeline detailing how OPM will close 7 down the information technology portal that MSP 8 issuers utilize.
- 9 (d) RESCISSION OF UNUSED FUNDS.—Of the 10 amounts made available to OPM for the purposes of staff-11 ing and administering the program under section 1334 of 12 the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, the unobligated balance is rescinded, effective October 1, 2018.
- (e) Sense of Congress.—It is the sense of Con-gress that—
- 16 (1) the Director of the Office of Personnel
  17 Management should assign employees of the Office
  18 whose duties on the date of enactment relate to car19 rying out section 1334 of the Patient Protection and
  20 Affordable Care Act (Public Law 111–148) to duties
  21 relating to processing appeals brought by individuals
  22 or employers pursuant to such section 1334; and

1 (2) no additional amounts should be appro-2 priated for salaries and expenses relating to proc-3 essing such appeals.

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
