## AN ACT

To amend the State Department Basic Authorities Act of 1956 regarding energy diplomacy and security within the Department of State, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

**1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Energy Diplomacy Act  
3 of 2018”.

**4 SEC. 2. ENERGY DIPLOMACY AND SECURITY WITHIN THE  
5 DEPARTMENT OF STATE.**

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subsection (c) of section 1 of the  
7 State Department Basic Authorities Act of 1956 (22  
8 U.S.C. 2651a) is amended—

9 (1) by redesignating paragraph (3) as para-  
10 graph (4); and

11 (2) by inserting after paragraph (2) the fol-  
12 lowing new paragraph:

13 “(3) ENERGY RESOURCES.—

14 “(A) AUTHORIZATION FOR ASSISTANT SEC-  
15 RETARY.—Subject to the numerical limitation  
16 specified in paragraph (1), there is authorized  
17 to be established in the Department of State an  
18 Assistant Secretary of State for Energy Re-  
19 sources.

20 “(B) PERSONNEL.—The Secretary of  
21 State shall ensure that there are sufficient per-  
22 sonnel dedicated to energy matters within the  
23 Department of State who shall be responsible  
24 for—

25 (i) formulating and implementing  
26 international policies, in coordination with

Secretary of Energy, as appropriate, aimed at protecting and advancing United States energy security interests by effectively managing United States bilateral and multilateral relations in the fields of petroleum, natural gas, biofuels, renewable energy, nuclear, and other energy resources;

“(ii) ensuring that analyses of the national security implications of global energy and environmental developments are reflected in the decision making process within the Department of State;

“(iii) incorporating energy security priorities into the activities of the Department of State;

“(iv) coordinating energy activities within the Department of State and with relevant Federal agencies;

“(v) working internationally to—

“(I) support the development of energy resources and the distribution of such resources for the benefit of the United States and United States allies and trading partners for their

10                             “(III) resolve international dis-  
11                             putes regarding the exploration, devel-  
12                             opment, production, or distribution of  
13                             energy resources;

“(V) support and coordinate international efforts to alleviate energy poverty;

1           departments and agencies on developing  
2           and implementing international energy-re-  
3           lated sanctions; and

4                 “(viii) coordinating energy security  
5                 and other relevant functions within the De-  
6                 partment of State currently undertaken  
7                 by—

8                     “(I) the Bureau of Economic and  
9                     Business Affairs of the Department of  
10                     State;

11                     “(II) the Bureau of Oceans and  
12                     International Environmental and Sci-  
13                     entific Affairs of the Department of  
14                     State; and

15                     “(III) other offices within the  
16                     Department of State.”.

17             (b) CONFORMING AMENDMENT.—Section 931 of the  
18             Energy Independence and Security Act of 2007 (42  
19             U.S.C. 17371) is amended—

20                     (1) by striking subsections (a) and (b); and

(2) by redesignating subsections (c) and (d) as subsections (a) and (b), respectively.
