- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Easy Medication Ac-
- 5 cess and Treatment for Opioid Addiction Act" or the
- 6 "Easy MAT for Opioid Addiction Act".

1	SEC. 2. ADMINISTRATION OF NARCOTIC DRUGS FOR THE
2	PURPOSE OF RELIEVING ACUTE WITH-
3	DRAWAL SYMPTOMS.
4	Not later than 180 days after the date of enactment
5	of this Act, the Attorney General shall revise section
6	1306.07(b) of title 21, Code of Federal Regulations, so
7	that practitioners are allowed to administer not more than
8	a three-day supply of medication to one person or for one
9	person's use at one time.
