A BILL

To amend the Consolidated Farm and Rural Development Act to modify provisions relating to the household water well system grant program.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Rural Septic Tank Ac-
- 5 cess Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. HOUSEHOLD WATER WELL SYSTEM GRANT PRO-
- 7 GRAM MODIFICATIONS.
- 8 Section 306E of the Consolidated Farm and Rural
- 9 Development Act (7 U.S.C. 1926e) is amended—

1	(1) by striking the section designation and
2	heading and inserting the following:
3	"SEC. 306E. GRANTS TO NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS FOR
4	CONSTRUCTION, REFURBISHING, AND SERV-
5	ICING OF INDIVIDUALLY OWNED HOUSE-
6	HOLD WATER WELL SYSTEMS AND HOUSE-
7	HOLD DECENTRALIZED WASTEWATER SYS-
8	TEMS IN RURAL AREAS FOR INDIVIDUALS
9	WITH LOW OR MODERATE INCOME.";
10	(2) in subsection (a), by striking "100 percent"
11	and inserting "60 percent";
12	(3) in subsection (b)—
13	(A) in paragraph (1)—
14	(i) by striking "loans" and inserting
15	"subgrants"; and
16	(ii) by inserting "or household decen-
17	tralized wastewater systems" after "water
18	well systems"; and
19	(B) by striking paragraph (2) and insert-
20	ing the following:
21	"(2) Subgrants.—
22	"(A) Amounts.—The amount of a
23	subgrant provided to an eligible individual using
24	grant funds under this section shall not exceed
25	\$20,000 for each water well system or decen-

tralized wastewater system described in paragraph (1).

"(B) USE IN CASES OF WELL WATER CON-TAMINATION.—In the event of well water contamination, the Secretary shall allow the use of a subgrant provided using grant funds under this section for the installation of water treatment measures as needed beyond the point of entry, with or without the installation of new well equipment.";

- (4) in subsection (c), by striking "productive use of individually-owned household water well systems" and inserting "effective use of individually owned household water well systems or household decentralized wastewater systems"; and
- (5) in subsection (d), by striking "\$5,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2014 through 2018" and inserting "\$100,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2019 through 2023".

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
