Mr. NORMAN introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Oversight and Government Reform

A BILL

To require the head of each agency to submit to the Government Accountability Office a monthly travel log, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Formally List Your
5 Travel Act” or the “FLY Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. REQUIREMENT TO SUBMIT MONTHLY TRAVEL**
7 **LOGS.**

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—Beginning October 1, 2018, on
9 the first day of each month, an agency head shall submit
10 to the Comptroller General of the United States a record

1 of any official travel itinerary (referred to in this section
2 as a “travel log”) of the agency head for the previous
3 month.

4 (b) PENALTY.—(1) Beginning with the fiscal quarter
5 beginning on January 1, 2019, an agency head shall, out
6 of funds appropriated specifically for the office of the
7 agency head, pay to the general fund of the Treasury an
8 amount equal to one percent of the annual budget of such
9 office for each month during the previous quarter with re-
10 spect to which the agency head has not submitted a travel
11 log by the last day of such previous quarter.

12 (2) Beginning with fiscal year 2020, in the case of
13 an agency head who has not submitted any travel log dur-
14 ing the previous fiscal year, the annual budget for the of-
15 fice of such agency head for the fiscal year shall be re-
16 duced by 15 percent.

17 (c) ANNUAL REPORT.—Not later than September 30
18 of each fiscal year, an agency head shall submit to the
19 Committee on Appropriations of the House of Representa-
20 tives and the Committee on Appropriations of the Senate
21 a report on the total amount of official travel expenses
22 incurred by the agency head during such fiscal year.

23 (d) PROHIBITION.—Any agency head who holds a
24 Senate-confirmed position may not purchase a first class
25 seat on an airplane using Federal funds.

1 (e) AGENCY DEFINED.—In this section, the term
2 “agency” has the meaning given that term in section 551
3 of title 5, United States Code.
