# **A BILL**

To amend title 38, United States Code, to make permanent the pilot program on counseling in retreat settings for women veterans newly separated from service in the Armed Forces.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
 2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Building Supportive  
 5 Networks for Women Veterans Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. COUNSELING IN RETREAT SETTINGS FOR WOMEN**  
 7 **VETERANS NEWLY SEPARATED FROM SERV-**  
 8 **ICE IN THE ARMED FORCES.**

9 (a) PERMANENT PROGRAM.—

10 (1) IN GENERAL.—Chapter 17 of title 38,  
 11 United States Code, is amended by inserting after  
 12 section 1712C the following new section:

13 **“§ 1712D. Counseling in retreat settings for women**  
 14 **veterans newly separated**

15 “(a) PROGRAM.—(1) Commencing on January 1,  
 16 2018, the Secretary shall carry out, through the Readjust-  
 17 ment Counseling Service of the Veterans Health Adminis-  
 18 tration, a program to provide reintegration and readjust-  
 19 ment services described in subsection (b) in group retreat  
 20 settings to women veterans who are recently separated  
 21 from service in the Armed Forces after a prolonged de-  
 22 ployment.

23 “(2) The participation of a veteran in the program  
 24 under paragraph (1) shall be at the election of the veteran.

1       “(b) COVERED SERVICES.—The services provided to  
 2 a woman veteran under the program under subsection  
 3 (a)(1) shall include the following:

4           “(1) Information on reintegration into the fam-  
 5 ily, employment, and community of the veteran.

6           “(2) Financial counseling.

7           “(3) Occupational counseling.

8           “(4) Information and counseling on stress re-  
 9 duction.

10          “(5) Information and counseling on conflict res-  
 11 olution.

12          “(6) Such other information and counseling as  
 13 the Secretary considers appropriate to assist the vet-  
 14 eran in reintegration into the family, employment,  
 15 and community of the veteran.

16       “(c) BIENNIAL REPORTS.—Not later than December  
 17 31, 2018, and each even-numbered year thereafter, the  
 18 Secretary shall submit to the Committees on Veterans’ Af-  
 19 fairs of the House of Representatives and the Senate a  
 20 report on the program under subsection (a)(1).”.

21       (2) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sec-  
 22 tions at the beginning of such chapter is amended  
 23 by inserting after the item relating to section 1712C  
 24 the following new item:

“1712D. Counseling in retreat settings for women veterans newly separated.”.

1       (b) CONFORMING REPEAL.—Effective December 31,  
2 2017, section 203 of the Caregivers and Veterans Omni-  
3 bus Health Services Act of 2010 (38 U.S.C. 1712A note)  
4 is repealed.

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
