Whereas Keiser University offers over 100 doctoral, specialist, master's, bachelor's, and associate degree programs in workforce sectors in Florida's industries, including nursing and physician's assistants, information technology and management information systems, logistics

and distribution, and defense and homeland security with degrees in cyber forensics and information security;

Whereas 66 percent of graduates complete degrees in the science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) and health care fields annually;

Whereas 70 percent of the student body is female;

Whereas Keiser University programs support nontraditional students, including veterans, first-generation students, parents, caregivers, and students who work full time or part time;

Whereas Keiser University has become Florida's third largest not-for-profit university, serving approximately 20,000 students, with over 66,000 alumni, and over 3,800 employees; and

Whereas Keiser University has grown internationally, with campuses in Shanghai, China, and in the Eastern European nation of Moldova: Now, therefore, be it
