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## AN ACT

To require the Federal Communications Commission to study the feasibility of designating a simple, easy-to-remember dialing code to be used for a national suicide prevention and mental health crisis hotline system.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “National Suicide Hot-  
3 line Improvement Act of 2017”.

4 **SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.**

5 In this Act—

6 (1) the term “Commission” means the Federal  
7 Communications Commission;

8 (2) the term “covered dialing code” means a  
9 simple, easy-to-remember, 3-digit dialing code; and

10 (3) the term “N11 dialing code” means an ab-  
11 breviated dialing code consisting of 3 digits, of  
12 which—

13 (A) the first digit may be any digit other  
14 than “1” or “0”; and

15 (B) each of the last 2 digits is “1”.

16 **SEC. 3. STUDIES AND REPORTS.**

17 (a) PRIMARY STUDY.—

18 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Commission, in coordi-  
19 nation with the Assistant Secretary for Mental  
20 Health and Substance Use and the Secretary of Vet-  
21 erns Affairs, shall conduct a study that—

22 (A) examines the feasibility of designating  
23 an N11 dialing code or other covered dialing  
24 code to be used for a national suicide preven-  
25 tion and mental health crisis hotline system;

26 and

1                                 (B) analyzes the effectiveness of the Na-  
2                                   tional Suicide Prevention Lifeline as of the date  
3                                   on which the study is initiated, including how  
4                                   well the lifeline is working to address the needs  
5                                   of veterans.

6                                 (2) REQUIREMENTS.—

7                                 (A) COMMISSION.—In conducting the  
8                                   study under paragraph (1), the Commission  
9                                   shall—

10                                   (i) consider—

11                                   (I) each of the N11 dialing codes,  
12                                   including the codes that are used for  
13                                   other purposes; and

14                                   (II) other covered dialing codes;

15                                   (ii) consult with the North American  
16                                   Numbering Council; and

17                                   (iii) review the information provided  
18                                   by the Assistant Secretary for Mental  
19                                   Health and Substance Use and the Sec-  
20                                   retary of Veterans Affairs under subpara-  
21                                   graphs (B) and (C), respectively, of this  
22                                   paragraph.

23                                 (B) SAMHSA STUDY AND REPORT TO AS-  
24                                   SIST COMMISSION.—To assist the Commission  
25                                   in conducting the study under paragraph (1),

1           the Assistant Secretary for Mental Health and  
2           Substance Use shall analyze and, not later than  
3           180 days after the date of enactment of this  
4           Act, report to the Commission on—

5                 (i) the potential impact of the des-  
6                 ignation of an N11 dialing code, or other  
7                 covered dialing code, for a suicide preven-  
8                 tion and mental health crisis hotline sys-  
9                 tem on—

10                 (I) suicide prevention;  
11                 (II) crisis services; and  
12                 (III) other suicide prevention and  
13                 mental health crisis hotlines, includ-  
14                 ing—

15                         (aa) the National Suicide  
16                         Prevention Lifeline; and  
17                         (bb) the Veterans Crisis  
18                         Line; and

19                 (ii) possible recommendations for im-  
20                 proving the National Suicide Prevention  
21                 Lifeline generally, which may include—

22                         (I) increased public education  
23                         and awareness; and  
24                         (II) improved infrastructure and  
25                         operations.

1    (C) VA STUDY AND REPORT TO ASSIST  
2    COMMISSION.—To assist the Commission in  
3    conducting the study under paragraph (1), the  
4   Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall study and,  
5    not later than 180 days after the date of enact-  
6    ment of this Act, report to the Commission on  
7    how well the National Suicide Prevention Life-  
8    line and the Veterans Crisis Line, as in effect  
9    on the date on which the study is initiated, is  
10    working to address the needs of veterans.

11    (b) PRIMARY COMMISSION REPORT.—

12    (1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 1 year after  
13    the date of enactment of this Act, the Commission,  
14    in coordination with the Assistant Secretary for  
15    Mental Health and Substance Use and the Secretary  
16    of Veterans Affairs, shall submit a report on the  
17    study conducted under subsection (a) that rec-  
18    ommends whether a particular N11 dialing code or  
19    other covered dialing code should be used for a na-  
20    tional suicide prevention and mental health crisis  
21    hotline system to—

22    (A) the Committee on Commerce, Science,  
23    and Transportation of the Senate;

24    (B) the Committee on Health, Education,  
25    Labor, and Pensions of the Senate; and

1   (C) the Committee on Energy and Com-  
2   merce of the House of Representatives.

3   (2) ADDITIONAL CONTENTS.—If the report sub-  
4   mitted by the Commission under paragraph (1) rec-  
5   ommends that a dialing code should be used, the re-  
6   port shall also—

7   (A) outline the logistics of designating  
8   such a dialing code;

9   (B) estimate the costs associated with des-  
10   ignating such a dialing code, including—

11   (i) the costs incurred by service pro-  
12   viders, including—

13   (I) translation changes in the  
14   network; and

15   (II) cell site analysis and re-  
16   programming by wireless carriers; and

17   (ii) the costs incurred by States and  
18   localities;

19   (C) provide recommendations for desig-  
20   nating such a dialing code;

21   (D) provide a cost-benefit analysis com-  
22   paring the recommended dialing code with the  
23   National Suicide Prevention Lifeline, as in ef-  
24   fect on the date on which the report is sub-  
25   mitted; and

- 1                         (E) make other recommendations, as ap-  
2                         propriate, for improving the National Suicide  
3                         Prevention Lifeline generally, which may in-  
4                         clude—  
5                                 (i) increased public education and  
6                         awareness; and  
7                                 (ii) improved infrastructure and oper-  
8                         ations.
