A BILL

To repeal certain provisions of the Federal Switchblade Act to allow domestic manufacturers to ship and sell their products to buyers located in other States and to permit the importation of certain knife parts.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Freedom of Commerce
5 Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. REPEAL OF CERTAIN LAWS RELATED TO SWITCH-**
2 **BLADE KNIVES.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Act entitled “An Act to pro-
4 hibit the introduction, or manufacture for introduction,
5 into interstate commerce of switchblade knives, and for
6 other purposes” (commonly known as the “Federal
7 Switchblade Act”) is amended by striking sections 1
8 through 4 (15 U.S.C. 1241 et seq.).

9 (b) CONFORMING AMENDMENTS.—Chapter 83 of
10 title 18, United States Code, is amended—

11 (1) in section 1716, by redesignating sub-
12 sections (h), (j), and (k) as subsections (g), (h), and
13 (i), respectively; and

14 (2) in section 1716E(i), by striking “section
15 1716(k)” and inserting “section 1716(i)”.

16 (c) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The repeals made by this
17 section—

18 (1) shall take effect on the date of enactment
19 of this Act; and

20 (2) shall not apply with respect to any indict-
21 ment, convictions, sentencing, appeals, civil or crimi-
22 nal fines or penalties obtained, forfeitures obtained,
23 terms of imprisonment, or any other enforcement ac-
24 tions or proceedings occurring or commenced before
25 the date of the enactment of this Act.
