A BILL

To reauthorize and extend funding for community health
centers and the National Health Service Corps.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Community Health In-
5 vestment, Modernization, and Excellence Act of 2017”.

1 **SEC. 2. EXTENSION OF FUNDING FOR COMMUNITY HEALTH**
 2 **CENTERS AND NATIONAL HEALTH SERVICE**
 3 **CORPS.**

4 Section 221 of the Medicare Access and CHIP Reau-
 5 thorization Act of 2015 is amended—

6 (1) in subsection (a), by adding at the end the
 7 following:

8 “(3) **ADDITIONAL FUNDING.**—In addition to
 9 amounts appropriated under section 10503(b) of the
 10 Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, there
 11 are appropriated to the CHC Fund the following:

12 “(A) For purposes of paragraph (1) of
 13 such section—

14 “(i) for fiscal year 2018,
 15 \$3,600,000,000;

16 “(ii) for fiscal year 2019,
 17 \$3,800,000,000;

18 “(iii) for fiscal year 2020,
 19 \$4,000,000,000;

20 “(iv) for fiscal year 2021,
 21 \$4,200,000,000; and

22 “(v) for fiscal year 2022,
 23 \$4,400,000,000.

24 “(B) For purposes of paragraph (2) of
 25 such section—

1 “(i) \$310,000,000 for fiscal year
2 2018;

3 “(ii) \$325,000,000 for fiscal year
4 2019;

5 “(iii) \$340,000,000 for fiscal year
6 2020;

7 “(iv) \$355,000,000 for fiscal year
8 2021; and

9 “(v) \$370,000,000 for fiscal year
10 2022.”; and

11 (2) in subsection (c), by striking “and fiscal
12 year 2107” and inserting “, fiscal year 2017, fiscal
13 year 2018, fiscal year 2019, fiscal year 2020, fiscal
14 year 2021, and fiscal year 2022”.

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
