## A BILL

To modify the presumption of service connection for veterans who were exposed to herbicide agents while serving in the Armed Forces in Thailand during the Vietnam era, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1     **SECTION 1. MODIFICATION OF PRESUMPTION OF SERVICE**  
2                 **CONNECTION FOR VETERANS WHO WERE EX-**  
3                 **POSED TO HERBICIDE AGENTS WHILE SERV-**  
4                 **ING IN THE ARMED FORCES IN THAILAND**  
5                 **DURING THE VIETNAM ERA.**

6     (a) **IN GENERAL.**—The Secretary of Veterans Affairs  
7 shall ensure that if the Secretary creates a presumption  
8 of service connection between the occurrence of a disease  
9 and exposure to a herbicide agent while serving in the  
10 Armed Forces during the Vietnam era at a military base  
11 in Thailand, such presumption also applies to exposure to  
12 a herbicide agent while serving in the Armed Forces dur-  
13 ing the Vietnam era at any military base located in Thai-  
14 land without regard to where on the base the veteran was  
15 located or what military job specialty the veteran per-  
16 formed.

17     (b) **DEFINITIONS.**—In this section:

18                 (1) **HERBICIDE AGENT.**—The term “herbicide  
19                 agent” has the meaning given such term in section  
20                 1116(a) of title 38, United States Code.

21                 (2) **VETERAN AND VIETNAM ERA.**—The terms  
22                 “veteran” and “Vietnam era” have the meaning  
23                 given such terms in section 101 of title 38, United  
24                 States Code.

1     **SEC. 2. BENEFITS FOR CHILDREN OF CERTAIN THAILAND**

2                 **SERVICE VETERANS BORN WITH SPINA**

3                 **BIFIDA.**

4         (a) IN GENERAL.—Subchapter III of chapter 18 of  
5 title 38, United States Code, is amended by adding at the  
6 end the following new section:

7     **“§ 1822. Benefits for children of certain Thailand**

8                 **service veterans born with spina bifida**

9         “(a) BENEFITS AUTHORIZED.—The Secretary may  
10 provide to any child of a veteran of covered service in  
11 Thailand who is suffering from spina bifida the health  
12 care, vocational training and rehabilitation, and monetary  
13 allowance required to be paid to a child of a Vietnam vet-  
14 eran who is suffering from spina bifida under subchapter  
15 I of this chapter as if such child of a veteran of covered  
16 service in Thailand were a child of a Vietnam veteran who  
17 is suffering from spina bifida under such subchapter.

18         “(b) SPINA BIFIDA CONDITIONS COVERED.—This  
19 section applies with respect to all forms and manifesta-  
20 tions of spina bifida, except spina bifida occulta.

21         “(c) VETERAN OF COVERED SERVICE IN THAI-  
22 LAND.—For purposes of this section, a veteran of covered  
23 service in Thailand is any individual, without regard to  
24 the characterization of that individual’s service, who—

25                 “(1) served in the active military, naval, or air  
26 service in Thailand, as determined by the Secretary

1       in consultation with the Secretary of Defense, dur-  
2       ing the period beginning on January 9, 1962, and  
3       ending on May 7, 1975; and

4           “(2) is determined by the Secretary, in con-  
5       sultation with the Secretary of Defense, to have been  
6       exposed to a herbicide agent during such service in  
7       Thailand.

8           “(d) HERBICIDE AGENT.—For purposes of this sec-  
9       tion, the term ‘herbicide agent’ means a chemical in a her-  
10      bicide used in support of United States and allied military  
11      operations in Thailand, as determined by the Secretary in  
12      consultation with the Secretary of Defense, during the pe-  
13      riod beginning on January 9, 1962, and ending on May  
14      7, 1975.”.

15           (b) CLERICAL AMENDMENTS.—

16           (1) SUBCHAPTER HEADING.—The heading for  
17       subchapter III of chapter 18 of such title is amend-  
18       ed by inserting “AND THAILAND” after  
19       “KOREA”.

20           (2) TABLE OF SECTIONS.—The table of sections  
21       at the beginning of chapter 18 of such title is  
22       amended—

23           (A) by striking the item relating to sub-  
24       chapter III and inserting the following new  
25       item:

“SUBCHAPTER III—CHILDREN OF CERTAIN KOREA AND THAILAND SERVICE VETERANS BORN WITH SPINA BIFIDA”;

1 and

2 (B) by inserting after the item relating to  
3 section 1821 the following new item:

“1822. Benefits for children of certain Thailand service veterans born with spina bifida.”.
