## A BILL

To require a study and report on the housing and service needs of victims of trafficking and individuals at risk for trafficking.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Trafficking Victims
- 5 Housing Act of 2017".
- 6 SEC. 2. STUDY AND REPORT ON HOUSING AND SERVICE
- 7 NEEDS OF VICTIMS OF TRAFFICKING AND IN-
- 8 DIVIDUALS AT RISK FOR TRAFFICKING.
- 9 (a) Definitions.—In this section, the terms "severe
- 10 forms of trafficking in persons" and "victim of traf-

- 1 ficking" have the meanings given those terms in section
- 2 103 of the Trafficking Victims Protection Act of 2000 (22
- 3 U.S.C. 7102).
- 4 (b) STUDY AND REPORT.—The United States Inter-
- 5 agency Council on Homelessness, in coordination with the
- 6 United States Advisory Council on Human Trafficking,
- 7 the Department of Housing and Urban Development, the
- 8 Administration for Children and Families of the Depart-
- 9 ment of Health and Human Services, and the Department
- 10 of Justice, and in consultation with the National Advisory
- 11 Committee on Sex Trafficking of Children and Youth in
- 12 the United States and direct service providers and housing
- 13 and homelessness practitioners, shall conduct a study as-
- 14 sessing the availability and accessibility of housing and
- 15 services for individuals experiencing homelessness who are
- 16 victims of trafficking, victims of severe forms of traf-
- 17 ficking in persons, or at risk of being trafficked, which
- 18 shall include—
- 19 (1) an evaluation of formal assessments and
- 20 outreach methods used to identify and assess the
- 21 housing and service needs of those individuals;
- 22 (2) a review of the availability and accessibility
- of homelessness or housing services for those individ-
- 24 uals, including the families of those individuals who

- 1 are minors and youth involved in foster care sys-2 tems;
- 3 (3) the effect of any policies and procedures of
  4 mainstream homelessness or housing services that
  5 facilitate or limit their availability and accessibility
  6 for those individuals, as those services are in effect
  7 as of the date on which the report is submitted;
  - (4) an assessment of the ability of mainstream homelessness or housing services to meet the specialized needs of victims of trafficking, including trauma responsive approaches specific to labor and sex trafficking victims;
    - (5) an evaluation of the effectiveness of and infrastructure considerations for housing and servicedelivery models that are specific to victims of severe forms of trafficking in persons, including emergency rental assistance models; and
  - (6) an identification of best practices in meeting the housing and service needs of those individuals.
- 21 (c) Report Submissions.—The United States
- 22 Interagency Council on Homelessness shall submit to the
- 23 Committee on Banking, Housing, and Urban Affairs of
- 24 the Senate and the Committee on Financial Services of
