Ms. HARRIS introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Armed Services

A BILL

To require the Secretary of Defense to establish the Defense Quantum Information Consortium, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the “Quantum Computing
5 Research Act of 2018”.

6 SEC. 2. SENSE OF CONGRESS.

7 It is the sense of Congress that—

8 (1) focused and continued investment in the de-
9 velopment of viable quantum information science
10 technology is vital to national security;

1 (2) quantum information science should address
2 two critical development problems, namely quantum
3 communication and quantum computing;

4 (3) alignment of effort within the United States
5 government, academic, and private sectors are vital
6 to ensuring the best technology is made available for
7 the defense of the United States; and

8 (4) to the extent possible to protect national se-
9 curity, work performed under section 3 should be
10 maintained at the lowest possible classification level
11 to promote coordination between consortium part-
12 ners and growth within the field of quantum infor-
13 mation science.

14 **SEC. 3. DEFENSE QUANTUM INFORMATION CONSORTIUM.**

15 (a) CONSORTIUM.—

16 (1) ESTABLISHMENT.—

17 (A) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of De-
18 fense shall, in coordination with the Director of
19 the Office of Science and Technology Policy, es-
20 tablish a consortium on matters relating to
21 quantum information sciences.

22 (B) DESIGNATION.—The consortium es-
23 tablished under paragraph (1) shall be known
24 as the “Defense Quantum Information Consor-
25 tium” (in this section the “Consortium”).

(B) one component composed of members selected by the Director of the Army Research Laboratory from among institutions of higher learning and industry partners located in the western half of the United States which are recognized for achievement in quantum information science.

17 (3) DUTIES.—

(B) DIRECTOR OF THE ARMY RESEARCH LABORATORY.—The Director of the Army Research Laboratory shall—

(i) coordinate and administer the grants awarded under subsection (b) to members selected under paragraph (2)(B); and

(ii) coordinate partnerships between such members.

10 (b) BOARD.—

11 (1) ESTABLISHMENT.—The Secretary shall, in
12 coordination with the Director, establish a board to
13 support the Consortium.

(A) The Chief of Naval Research and a
designee of the Chief.

(B) The Director of the Army Research Laboratory and a designee of the Director.

(C) The Assistant Director of Quantum Information Science at the Office of Science and Technology Policy.

(D) Members of the National Quantum Initiative (NQI).

(3) DUTIES.—The duties of the board established under paragraph (1) are as follows:

3 (A) To award grants under subsection (c).

(C) To facilitate partnerships between members of the Consortium.

9 (c) GRANTS.—

10 (1) IN GENERAL.—The board established under
11 subsection (b)(1) shall award grants to members of
12 the Consortium to conduct research on matters re-
13 lating to quantum information science.

(3) SELECTION.—

5 (i) develop a competitive application
6 and grant making process that furthers
7 the goals of ensuring the competitiveness
8 of the United States in quantum informa-
9 tion science; and

10 (ii) exercise that process to solicit
11 grant applications from Consortium mem-
12 bers, select among applications, and grant
13 high quality awards.

14 (4) CONFLICTS OF INTEREST.—In any case in
15 which a member of the board established under sub-
16 section (b)(1) or the committee established under
17 paragraph (3)(A) of this subsection has a conflict of
18 interest with an applicant or an application for a
19 grant under this subsection, such member shall
20 recuse him or herself from all matters relating to
21 consideration of such applicant or application.

22 (d) TERMINATION.—The requirements and authori-
23 ties of this section shall terminate at the end of fiscal year
24 2024.

1 (e) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There is
2 authorized to be appropriated such sums as may be nec-
3 essary to carry out this section.
