## A BILL

To provide for the establishment of a national registry to track cases of coccidioidomycosis, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Combat Valley Fever  
5 Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. TRACKING CASES OF COCCIDIOIDOMYCOSIS.**

7 (a) REGISTRY.—

8 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Health and  
9 Human Services (referred to in this section as the  
10 “Secretary”), acting through the Centers for Disease

1 Control and Prevention and in consultation with the  
2 Secretary of Agriculture, shall establish a registry  
3 for reports of cases of coccidioidomycosis.

4 (2) GRANT PROGRAM.—The Secretary shall  
5 award grants to States and State and local depart-  
6 ments of health for the purpose of supporting the  
7 surveillance of cases of coccidioidomycosis within the  
8 applicable State, and the reporting of any such cases  
9 to the registry established under paragraph (1).

10 (3) YEAR OF DIAGNOSIS.—In listing cases of  
11 coccidioidomycosis in the registry established under  
12 paragraph (1), the Secretary shall attribute each  
13 case to the year in which it was diagnosed.

14 (b) PROTOCOLS AND GUIDELINES.—The Secretary,  
15 in consultation with the Secretary of Agriculture, shall  
16 make publicly available any protocols and guidelines devel-  
17 oped by the Department of Agriculture, the National In-  
18 stitutes of Health, the Centers for Disease Control and  
19 Prevention, or appropriate professional health care organi-  
20 zations, for purposes of educating health care providers,  
21 farmers, and other agricultural workers regarding the  
22 most recent scientific and medical information on the eti-  
23 ology, transmission, diagnosis, surveillance, and treatment  
24 of coccidioidomycosis.

1       (c) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There  
2 are authorized to be appropriated such sums as may be  
3 necessary to carry out this section.
