A BILL

To amend the Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act to establish a program for the procurement of domestically grown unprocessed fruits and vegetables to provide healthier school meals, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*

2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Local School Foods

5 Expansion Act of 2018”.

1 **SEC. 2. PROGRAM FOR PROCUREMENT OF DOMESTICALLY**
2 **GROWN UNPROCESSED FRUITS AND VEGETA-**
3 **BLES.**

4 Section 6(f) of the Richard B. Russell National
5 School Lunch Act (42 U.S.C. 1755(f)) is amended—

6 (1) in the subsection heading, by striking
7 “PILOT PROJECT FOR PROCUREMENT OF” and in-
8 serting “PROGRAM FOR PROCUREMENT OF DOMES-
9 TICALLY GROWN”;

10 (2) in paragraph (1)—

11 (A) by striking “pilot project” and insert-
12 ing “program (referred to in this subsection as
13 the ‘program’)”;

14 (B) by striking “conduct” and inserting
15 “carry out”;

16 (C) by inserting “domestically grown” be-
17 fore “unprocessed”; and

18 (D) by striking “more than 8” and insert-
19 ing “less than 15”;

20 (3) by striking “pilot project” each place it ap-
21 pears and inserting “program”;

22 (4) in paragraph (2), in the matter preceding
23 subparagraph (A), by inserting “domestically
24 grown” before “unprocessed”;

25 (5) in paragraph (4)—

(A) in subparagraph (B), by striking
“and” at the end;

(B) in subparagraph (C), by striking the period at the end and inserting “; and”; and

5 (C) by adding at the end the following:

6 “(D) the demonstrated ability of the States
7 to competitively procure domestically grown un-
8 processed fruits and vegetables.”;

9 (6) in paragraph (5)—

14 (B) in subparagraph (B)—

19 (iii) by adding at the end the fol-
20 lowing:

“(iii) the challenges and opportunities presented by the program in the State.”; and

(C) by adding at the end the following:

25 “(C) PROGRAM EVALUATION.—

1 “(i) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 2
2 years after the date of enactment of this
3 subparagraph, the Secretary shall evaluate
4 the impact of the program, including with
5 respect to—

6 “(I) the quantity and cost of
7 each type of unprocessed fruit and
8 vegetable procured by each State
9 under the program;

10 “(II) the benefit of the procured
11 unprocessed fruits and vegetables to
12 school food service in each State, in-
13 cluding the benefit to meeting school
14 meal requirements; and

15 “(III) the economic impact of the
16 program on agricultural producers in
17 the State.

18 “(ii) REPORT.—Not later than 4
19 years after the date of enactment of this
20 subparagraph, the Secretary shall submit
21 to the Committee on Agriculture of the
22 House of Representatives and the Com-
23 mittee on Agriculture, Nutrition, and For-
24 estry of the Senate a report that describes
25 the results of the evaluation conducted

1 under clause (i) and an analysis of that
2 evaluation.”; and

3 (7) by adding at the end the following:

4 “(6) FUNDING.—

5 “(A) MANDATORY FUNDING.—There is ap-
6 propriated to carry out this subsection
7 \$15,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2019
8 through 2023.

9 “(B) RESERVATION.—Of the funds appro-
10 priated under subparagraph (A) for each fiscal
11 year, \$10,000,000 shall be reserved for States
12 selected under the program under paragraph
13 (1) to carry out the activities described in sub-
14 paragraph (C)(i).

15 “(C) ADMINISTRATIVE COSTS; TECHNICAL
16 ASSISTANCE.—

17 “(i) IN GENERAL.—The funds re-
18 served under subparagraph (B) shall be
19 used—

20 “(I) for the administrative costs
21 of carrying out the program; and

22 “(II) to provide technical assist-
23 ance and outreach to vendors to be-
24 come certified to participate in the
25 program.

1 “(ii) MINIMUM ALLOTMENT.—Of the
2 funds reserved under subparagraph (B),
3 each State selected under paragraph
4 (3)(A) shall receive not less than \$300,000
5 for each fiscal year during which the State
6 participates in the program.”.

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
