A BILL

To reauthorize the Traumatic Brain Injury program.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Traumatic Brain In-
5 jury Program Reauthorization Act of 2018”.

6 **SEC. 2. PREVENTION AND CONTROL OF INJURIES.**

7 Part J of title III of the Public Health Service Act
8 (42 U.S.C. 280b et seq.) is amended—

1 (1) in section 393C (42 U.S.C. 280b-1d) by
2 adding at the end the following:

3 “(e) NATIONAL CONCUSSION DATA COLLECTION AND
4 ANALYSIS.—The Secretary, acting through the Director of
5 the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, may im-
6 plement concussion data collection and analysis to deter-
7 mine the prevalence and incidence of concussion.”; and

8 (2) in section 394A(b)(42 U.S.C. 280b-3(b)),
9 by striking “\$6,564,000 for each of fiscal years
10 2015 through 2019” and inserting “\$11,750,000 for
11 each of fiscal years 2020 through 2024”.

12 **SEC. 3. STATE GRANTS FOR PROJECTS REGARDING TRAU-
13 MATIC BRAIN INJURY.**

14 Section 1252 of the Public Health Service Act (42
15 U.S.C. 300d-52) is amended—

16 (1) in subsection (a), by inserting “, acting
17 through the Administrator for the Administration
18 for Community Living,” after “The Secretary”;

19 (2) by striking subsection (e);

20 (3) by redesignating subsections (f) through (j)
21 as subsections (e) through (i), respectively; and

22 (4) in subsection (i), as so redesignated, by
23 striking “\$5,500,000 for each of the fiscal years
24 2015 through 2019” and inserting “\$7,321,000 for
25 each of fiscal years 2020 through 2024”.

1 **SEC. 4. STATE GRANTS FOR PROTECTION AND ADVOCACY**

2 **SERVICES.**

3 Section 1253 of the Public Health Service Act (42

4 U.S.C. 300d–53) is amended—

5 (1) in subsection (a), by inserting “, acting
6 through the Administrator for the Administration
7 for Community Living,” after “The Secretary”; and

8 (2) in subsection (1), by striking “\$3,100,000
9 for each of the fiscal years 2015 through 2019” and
10 inserting “\$4,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2020
11 through 2024”.

12 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

13 This Act may be cited as the “Traumatic Brain Injury
14 Program Reauthorization Act of 2018”.

15 **SEC. 2. PREVENTION AND CONTROL OF INJURIES.**

16 Part J of title III of the Public Health Service Act
17 (42 U.S.C. 280b et seq.) is amended—

18 (1) in section 393C (42 U.S.C. 280b–1d) by add-
19 ing at the end the following:

20 “(c) NATIONAL CONCUSSION DATA COLLECTION AND
21 ANALYSIS.—The Secretary, acting through the Director of
22 the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, may imple-
23 ment concussion data collection and analysis to determine
24 the prevalence and incidence of concussion.”;

25 (2) in section 394A(b)(42 U.S.C. 280b–3(b)), by
26 striking “\$6,564,000 for each of fiscal years 2015

1 *through 2019” and inserting “\$11,750,000 for each of*
2 *fiscal years 2020 through 2024”; and*
3 (3) by striking section 393C-1 (42 U.S.C. 280b-
4 1e).

5 **SEC. 3. STATE GRANTS FOR PROJECTS REGARDING TRAU-
6 MATIC BRAIN INJURY.**

7 *Section 1252 of the Public Health Service Act (42*
8 *U.S.C. 300d-52) is amended—*

9 (1) in subsection (a), by inserting “, acting
10 *through the Administrator for the Administration for*
11 *Community Living,” after “The Secretary”;*
12 (2) by striking subsection (e);
13 (3) by redesignating subsections (f) through (j)
14 *as subsections (e) through (i), respectively; and*
15 (4) in subsection (i), as so redesignated, by strik-
16 *ing “\$5,500,000 for each of the fiscal years 2015*
17 *through 2019” and inserting “\$7,321,000 for each of*
18 *fiscal years 2020 through 2024”.*

19 **SEC. 4. STATE GRANTS FOR PROTECTION AND ADVOCACY
20 SERVICES.**

21 *Section 1253 of the Public Health Service Act (42*
22 *U.S.C. 300d-53) is amended—*

23 (1) in subsection (a), by inserting “, acting
24 *through the Administrator for the Administration for*
25 *Community Living,” after “The Secretary”; and*

1 (2) in subsection (l), by striking “\$3,100,000 for
2 each of the fiscal years 2015 through 2019” and in-
3 serting “\$4,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2020
4 through 2024”.

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
