Mrs. FEINSTEIN introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

For the relief of Jorge Rojas Gutierrez and Oliva Gonzalez.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. PERMANENT RESIDENT STATUS FOR JORGE**
4 **ROJAS GUTIERREZ AND OLIVA GONZALEZ.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding subsections (a)
6 and (b) of section 201 of the Immigration and Nationality
7 Act (8 U.S.C. 1151), Jorge Rojas Gutierrez and Oliva
8 Gonzalez shall each be eligible for the issuance of an immi-
9 grant visa or for adjustment of status to that of an alien
10 lawfully admitted for permanent residence upon filing an
11 application for issuance of an immigrant visa under sec-

tion 204 of such Act (8 U.S.C. 1154) or for adjustment of status to lawful permanent resident.

(b) ADJUSTMENT OF STATUS.—If Jorge Rojas Gutierrez or Oliva Gonzalez enters the United States before the filing deadline specified in subsection (c), Jorge Rojas Gutierrez or Oliva Gonzalez, as appropriate, shall be considered to have entered and remained lawfully in the United States and shall be eligible for adjustment of status under section 245 of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1255) as of the date of the enactment of this Act.

(c) DEADLINE FOR APPLICATION AND PAYMENT OF FEES.—Subsections (a) and (b) shall apply only if the application for the issuance of an immigrant visa or the application for adjustment of status is filed with appropriate fees not later than two years after the date of the enactment of this Act.

(d) REDUCTION OF IMMIGRANT VISA NUMBERS.—Upon granting immigrant visas or permanent residence to Jorge Rojas Gutierrez and Oliva Gonzalez, the Secretary of State shall instruct the proper officer to reduce by two, during the current or next following fiscal year—

(1) the total number of immigrant visas that are made available to natives of the country of birth of Jorge Rojas Gutierrez and Oliva Gonzalez under

3 (2) if applicable, the total number of immigrant
4 visas that are made available to natives of the coun-
5 try of birth of Jorge Rojas Gutierrez and Oliva Gon-
6 zalez under section 202(e) of such Act (8 U.S.C.
7 1152(e)).

8 (e) PAYGO.—The budgetary effects of this Act, for
9 the purpose of complying with the Statutory Pay-As-You-
10 Go Act of 2010, shall be determined by reference to the
11 latest statement titled “Budgetary Effects of PAYGO
12 Legislation” for this Act, submitted for printing in the
13 Congressional Record by the Chairman of the Senate
14 Budget Committee, provided that such statement has been
15 submitted prior to the vote on passage.

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
