JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States to limit the number of terms a Representative or Senator may serve.

- 1 Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives
- 2 of the United States of America in Congress assembled
- 3 (two-thirds of each House concurring therein), That the fol-
- 4 lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con-
- 5 stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all
- 6 intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when
- 7 ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several
- 8 States within seven years after the date of its submission
- 9 for ratification:

1	"ARTICLE—
2	"Section 1. No person who has been a Senator for
3	two terms shall again be eligible for election or appoint-

- 4 ment to the Senate.
- 5 "Section 2. No person who has been a Representa-
- 6 tive for six terms shall again be eligible for election to the
- 7 House of Representatives.
- 8 "Section 3. For the purposes of this article, any
- 9 term that began before the date of the ratification of this
- 10 article shall not be included in determining the number
- 11 of terms that a person has been a Senator or Representa-
- 12 tive.".
