A BILL

To direct the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to provide a process by which a family member of a deceased individual who is eligible for the Department of Veterans Affairs burn pit registry may register for such registry on behalf of the deceased individual.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Family Member Access
5 to Burn Pit Registry Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. AUTHORITY FOR FAMILY MEMBERS TO REGISTER**
2 **FOR DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS**
3 **BURN PIT REGISTRY ON BEHALF OF DE-**
4 **CEASED ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUALS.**

5 Section 201 of the Dignified Burial and Other Vet-
6 erans' Benefits Improvement Act of 2012 (Public Law
7 112–260; 38 U.S.C. 527 note) is amended—

8 (1) by redesignating subsection (c) as sub-
9 section (d); and

10 (2) by inserting after subsection (b) the fol-
11 lowing new subsection (c):

12 “(c) REGISTRATION ON BEHALF OF DECEASED INDI-
13 VIDUALS.—In the case of a deceased eligible individual,
14 the Secretary shall provide a process by which an imme-
15 diate family member of the individual may register for the
16 burn pit registry under this section on behalf of the de-
17 ceased eligible individual.”.

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
