A BILL

To amend the Child Nutrition Act of 1966 to clarify the availability and appropriateness of training for local food service personnel, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the “Improving Training
5 for School Food Service Workers Act”.

6 SEC. 2. PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT AND TRAINING.

7 Section 7(g)(2)(B) of the Child Nutrition Act of 1966
8 (42 U.S.C. 1776(g)(2)(B)) is amended by adding at the
9 end the following:

1 “(iv) AVAILABILITY AND APPRO-
2 PRIATENESS OF TRAINING.—A training
3 program carried out under this subparagraph
4 shall be—

5 “(I) a program scheduled primarily during regular, paid working
6 hours, and in the event such program
7 is scheduled outside of such working
8 hours—

9
10 “(aa) efforts shall be made
11 to inform food service personnel
12 of the necessity of such program
13 to be so scheduled;

14 “(bb) compensation shall be
15 provided to such personnel for attending such program; and

16 “(cc) such personnel shall
17 not be penalized for not being
18 able to attend such program; and

19 “(II) offered in-person whenever
20 appropriate, and incorporate hands-on
21 training techniques.”.

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
