Ms. KUSTER of New Hampshire (for herself and Mr. GONZALEZ of Ohio) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

To amend the KIDS Act of 2008 to require sex offenders to provide online and mobile identifiers, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Protecting our KIDS
5 Act of 2020”.

6 **SEC. 2. DIRECTION TO THE ATTORNEY GENERAL.**

7 Section 2(a) of the KIDS Act of 2008 (34 U.S.C.
8 20916(a)) is amended—

1 (1) by striking “The Attorney” and inserting
2 “(1) IN GENERAL.—The Attorney”; and

3 (2) by adding at the end the following:

4 “(2) INTERNET IDENTIFIERS.—For purposes of
5 paragraph (1), the internet identifiers required to be
6 provided—

7 “(A) shall include—

8 “(i) all identifiers used for commu-
9 nication on mobile applications and inter-
10 net websites;

11 “(ii) all account names and identifiers
12 used to access social networking platforms;

13 “(iii) mobile telephone numbers; and

14 “(iv) device ID information; and

15 “(B) shall not include personal passwords
16 used to access social networking platforms.”.

17 **SEC. 3. SOCIAL NETWORKING WEBSITE.**

18 Section 2(e)(1)(A) of the KIDS Act of 2008 (34
19 U.S.C. 20916(e)(1)(A)) is amended—

20 (1) in the matter preceding clause (i), by insert-
21 ing “or mobile application” after “website”; and

22 (2) in clause (ii), by striking “where such users
23 are likely to include a substantial number of mi-
24 nors”.

1 **SEC. 4. REPORT TO CONGRESS.**

2 Not later than 1 year after the date of enactment
3 of this Act, the Inspector General of the Department of
4 Justice shall submit to Congress a report on audit findings
5 with respect to the implementation of—

6 (1) section 2 of the KIDS Act of 2008 (34
7 U.S.C. 20916), as amended by this Act; and

8 (2) section 3 of the KIDS Act of 2008 (34
9 U.S.C. 20917).

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
