A BILL

To repeal section 230 of the Communications Act of 1934 (commonly referred to as the Communications Decency Act) to stop censorship, and for other purposes.

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Abandoning Online
5 Censorship Act” or the “AOC Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. REPEAL OF SECTION 230 OF THE COMMUNICATIONS**
2 **ACT OF 1934 (COMMONLY REFERRED TO AS**
3 **THE COMMUNICATIONS DECENCY ACT).**

4 (a) SECTION 230 OF THE COMMUNICATIONS ACT OF
5 1934.—Effective as of enactment of this language, section
6 230 of the Communications Act of 1934 (47 U.S.C.
7 230(c)) is repealed.

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
