3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Gambling Addiction

5 Prevention Act of 2019".

6	(a) Policies and Programs.—
7	(1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Defense
8	shall develop and implement policies and programs
9	on prevention, education, and treatment of gambling
10	disorder and integrate gambling disorder into exist-
11	ing mental health and substance use disorder pro-
12	grams.
13	(2) CONSULTATION.—The Secretary shall de-
14	velop the policies and programs described in para-
15	graph (1) in coordination with the Secretary of Vet-
16	erans Affairs, the Secretary of Homeland Security,

20	(1) IN GENERAL.—In carrying out policies and
21	programs developed and implemented under sub-
22	section $(a)(1)$, if the Secretary hosts or provides
23	gambling activities at a morale, welfare, and recre-
24	ation facility of the Department of Defense, the Sec-
25	retary shall, at that facility—

1 (i) educational materials and a list of 2 resources to assist and empower members 3 of the Armed Forces to identify the risks 4 of gambling; and (ii) a list of resources and informa-5 6 tional material on where such members can 7 seek help if they develop gambling dis-8 order; and 9 (B) implement measures that encourage 10 responsible behavior consistent with measures 11 authorized and required by commercial and 12 tribal gaming regulators in the United States. 13 (2) FUNDING OF MEASURES.—The Secretary 14 shall fund measures implemented under paragraph 15 (1)(B) through the use of proceeds generated by 16 gambling activities at morale, welfare, and recreation 17 facilities of the Department. 18 (c) REPORT.—Not later than one year after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall submit 19 to the congressional defense committees a report on efforts 20 21 undertaken under this section. 22 (d) CONGRESSIONAL DEFENSE COMMITTEES DE-

(d) CONGRESSIONAL DEFENSE COMMITTEES DEFINED.—In this section, the term "congressional defense
committees" has the meaning given that term in section
101 of title 10, United States Code.

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1SEC. 3. UPDATE OF DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE REGULA-2TIONS, INSTRUCTIONS, AND OTHER GUID-3ANCE TO INCLUDE GAMBLING DISORDER.

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days after the 5 date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of De-6 fense, in consultation with the Secretaries of the military 7 departments, shall update all regulations, instructions, 8 and other guidance of the Department of Defense and the 9 military departments with respect to behavioral health to 10 explicitly include gambling disorder.

(b) MILITARY DEPARTMENTS DEFINED.—In this
section, the term "military departments" has the meaning
given that term in section 101(8) of title 10, United States
Code.

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
