A BILL

To terminate certain waivers of sanctions with respect to Iran issued in connection with the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. TERMINATION OF CERTAIN WAIVERS OF SANC-**
4 **TIONS WITH RESPECT TO NUCLEAR ACTIVI-**
5 **TIES IN OR WITH IRAN.**

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Effective on the date of the enact-
7 ment of this Act, any waiver of the application of sanctions
8 provided for under sections 1244, 1245, 1246, and 1247
9 of the Iran Freedom and Counter-Proliferation Act of

1 2012 (22 U.S.C. 8803, 8804, 8805, and 8806) for or to
 2 enable an activity described in subsection (b) is termi-
 3 nated, and the President may not issue a new such waiver
 4 for such an activity on or after such date of enactment.

5 (b) ACTIVITIES DESCRIBED.—An activity described
 6 in this subsection is a nuclear activity in or with Iran with
 7 respect to which a waiver described in subsection (a) was
 8 issued in connection with the Joint Comprehensive Plan
 9 of Action, including the following:

10 (1) The Arak reactor redesign.

11 (2) The transfer into Iran of enriched uranium
 12 for the Tehran Research Reactor.

13 (3) The modification of 2 centrifuge cascades at
 14 the Fordow facility for nonsensitive purposes.

15 (c) JOINT COMPREHENSIVE PLAN OF ACTION DE-
 16 FINED.—In this section, the term “Joint Comprehensive
 17 Plan of Action” means the Joint Comprehensive Plan of
 18 Action signed at Vienna on July 14, 2015, by Iran and
 19 by France, Germany, the Russian Federation, the People’s
 20 Republic of China, the United Kingdom, and the United
 21 States, and all implementing materials and agreements re-
 22 lated to the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action.

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
