A BILL

To require States and hospitals to report COVID–19 health
data directly to the Centers for Disease Control and
Prevention.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Transparent Reporting
5 and Use of Statistics in the Transmission of Coronavirus
6 Data Collection” or the “TRUST CDC Act”.

7 **SEC. 2. SHARING OF COVID–19 HEALTH DATA.**

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding the updates to
9 the guidance of the White House Coronavirus Task Force

1 entitled, “COVID–19 Guidance for Hospital Reporting
2 and FAQs For Hospitals, Hospital Laboratory, and Acute
3 Care Facility Data Reporting”, issued on July 10, 2020,
4 States and hospitals required to report data with respect
5 to COVID–19 pursuant to such guidance shall report such
6 information directly to the Centers for Disease Control
7 and Prevention, and shall not be required to report such
8 data to the Department of Health and Human Services
9 as described in such updates.

10 (b) PUBLIC POSTING OF DATA; UPDATES.—The Di-
11 rector of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention
12 shall—

13 (1) not later than 7 days after the date of en-
14 actment of this Act, reinstate the website of such
15 agency containing COVID–19 data, including the
16 number of cases, deaths, and diagnostic and sero-
17 logic tests per State; and

18 (2) update such data on such website daily
19 thereafter.
