## A BILL

To modernize the reporting requirement under the Telephone Consumer Protection Act of 1991.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

**3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “Federal Communications Commission Reporting Modernization Act of 2019”.

**6 SEC. 2. TCPA ENFORCEMENT REPORT.**

7       Section 227(h) of the Communications Act of 1934 (47 U.S.C. 227(h)) is amended to read as follows:

9       “(h) TCPA ENFORCEMENT REPORT.—The Commission shall submit an annual report to Congress regarding

1 the enforcement during the preceding year of laws, regula-  
2 tions, and policies relating to robocalls and spoofed calls,  
3 which report shall include—

4 “(1) the number of complaints received by the  
5 Commission during the year alleging that a con-  
6 sumer received a robocall or spoofed call;

7 “(2) the number of citations issued by the Com-  
8 mission pursuant to section 503 during the year to  
9 enforce any law, regulation, or policy relating to a  
10 robocall or spoofed call;

11 “(3) the number of notices of apparent liability  
12 issued by the Commission pursuant to section 503  
13 during the year to enforce any law, regulation, or  
14 policy relating to a robocall or spoofed call; and

15 “(4) for each notice referred to in paragraph  
16 (3)—

17 “(A) the amount of the proposed forfeiture  
18 penalty involved;

19 “(B) the person to whom the notice was  
20 issued; and

21 “(C) the status of the proceeding.”.
