A BILL

To allow the use of unspent educational funds under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 to address pandemic learning loss through Child Opportunity Scholarships.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Raising Expectations
5 with Child Opportunity Vouchers for Educational Recov-
6 ery Act” or the “RECOVER Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. USE OF UNOBLIGATED AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN**
2 **ACT FUNDS FOR CHILD OPPORTUNITY**
3 **SCHOLARSHIPS.**

4 Section 2001 of the American Rescue Plan Act of
5 2021 (20 U.S.C. 3401 note) is amended—

6 (1) in subsection (e)(1)—

7 (A) by striking “through the implementa-
8 tion of” and inserting “through—

9 “(A) the implementation of”;

10 (B) in subparagraph (A), as designated by
11 subparagraph (A) of this paragraph, by striking
12 “; and” and inserting “; or”; and

13 (C) by inserting after subparagraph (A),
14 as designated by subparagraph (A) of this para-
15 graph, the following:

16 “(B) the distribution of Child Opportunity
17 Scholarships; and”;

18 (2) in subsection (f)—

19 (A) in paragraph (3), by striking “and” at
20 the end;

21 (B) in paragraph (4), by striking the pe-
22 riod at the end and inserting “; and”; and

23 (C) by adding after paragraph (4) the fol-
24 lowing:

25 “(5) may use any remaining amounts to dis-
26 tribute Child Opportunity Scholarships.”; and

1 (3) in subsection (h)—

2 (A) by redesignating paragraphs (2) and
3 (3) as paragraphs (4) and (6), respectively;

4 (B) by inserting after paragraph (1) the
5 following:

6 “(2) the term ‘Child Opportunity Scholarship’
7 means direct financial assistance to the parent or
8 guardian of an eligible student for a qualified edu-
9 cational expense in an amount reasonably commen-
10 surate to the negative educational impact intended
11 to be addressed;

12 “(3) the term ‘eligible student’ means a child
13 who is a member of a household with an income
14 which is not greater than 300 percent of the Federal
15 poverty level;”;

16 (C) in paragraph (4), as redesignated by
17 subparagraph (A), by striking “and” after the
18 semicolon; and

19 (D) by inserting after paragraph (4), as
20 redesignated by subparagraph (A), the fol-
21 lowing:

22 “(5) the term ‘qualified educational expense’ in-
23 cludes tutoring or educational classes outside the
24 home, curriculum and curricular materials, books or
25 instructional materials, technological education ma-

1 terials, online educational materials, private school
2 tuition, testing fees, diagnostic tools, and edu-
3 cational therapies for students with disabilities;
4 and”.
