A BILL

To direct the Secretary of Labor to conduct a study on the effectiveness of spending by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration to provide technical assistance and compliance assistance in relation to heat-related illness.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Timothy J. Barber
5 Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. REPORT ON HEAT-RELATED ILLNESS IN COOL-**
2 **WEATHER STATES.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Labor shall con-
4 duct a study on spending by the Occupational Safety and
5 Health Administration to provide technical assistance and
6 compliance assistance in relation to heat-related illness, in-
7 cluding—

8 (1) the effectiveness of such spending at both
9 national and regional levels; and

10 (2) determining how such spending may be
11 made more effective.

12 (b) REPORT.—Not later than 180 days after the date
13 of enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall submit to
14 Congress a report containing the results of such study,
15 including recommendations on legislative actions or other
16 actions that may be necessary to improve the effectiveness
17 of such spending.

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
