Mr. VINDMAN (for himself and Mr. BACON) introduced the following bill;
which was referred to the Committee on Armed Services

A BILL

To require a report on the threat posed by violent anti-
semitism as a component of transnational extremist
movements.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Violent Antisemitism
5 Threat Assessment Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. REPORT ON THE THREAT POSED BY VIOLENT ANTI-**
7 **SEMITISM AS A COMPONENT OF**
8 **TRANSNATIONAL EXTREMIST MOVEMENTS.**

9 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than March 20, 2026,
10 the Secretary of Defense shall submit to the appropriate

1 congressional committees a report on the threat posed by
2 violent antisemitism as a component of transnational ex-
3 tremist movements.

4 (b) MATTERS TO BE INCLUDED.—The report re-
5 quired by subsection (a) should include the following:

6 (1) An overview of transnational violent extrem-
7 ist ideologies that include antisemitic components,
8 including racially and ethnically motivated violent
9 extremism.

10 (2) A review of violence committed on behalf of
11 or motivated by such ideologies, including identifica-
12 tion of violent acts committed with explicit
13 antisemitic sentiment and an overview of propa-
14 ganda facilitating the spread of such ideologies, with
15 an in-depth assessment of the antisemitic compo-
16 nents of such propaganda.

17 (3) An assessment of the threat that such
18 antisemitic violence poses to the United States
19 homeland, citizens of the United States residing
20 abroad, and personnel of the United States Govern-
21 ment, including members of the Armed Forces, and
22 how such threats affect the interests and global
23 standing of the United States.

1 (c) APPROPRIATE CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEES DE-
2 FINED.—In this section, the term “appropriate congres-
3 sional committees” means—

4 (1) the Committee on Armed Services of the
5 House of Representatives; and

6 (2) the Committee on Armed Services of the
7 Senate.
