A BILL

To allow the U.S. Marshals Service to assist in certain Tribal criminal matters, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Tribal Warrant Fair-
5 ness Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. AMENDMENTS.**

7 (a) U.S. MARSHALS SERVICE.—Section 566(e)(1) of
8 title 28, United States Code, is amended—

1 (1) in subparagraph (B), by inserting “includ-
2 ing Tribal fugitive matters (on the request of an In-
3 dian Tribe, as applicable),” after “matters,”; and

4 (2) in subparagraph (D), by inserting “Tribal,”
5 after “local,”.

6 (b) PRESIDENTIAL THREAT PROTECTION ACT OF
7 2000.—Section 6 of the Presidential Threat Protection
8 Act of 2000 (34 U.S.C. 41503) is amended—

9 (1) in subsection (a)—

10 (A) by inserting “and Indian Tribes” after
11 “components”; and

12 (B) by striking “and local” and inserting
13 “local, and Tribal”; and

14 (2) in subsection (c), by striking “Federal or
15 State law” and inserting “Federal, State, or Tribal
16 law”.

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
