A BILL

To amend the Immigration and Nationality Act to provide that an alien convicted of an offense involving animal cruelty is inadmissible and deportable, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Illegal Alien Animal
5 Abuser Removal Act of 2026”.

1 **SEC. 2. INADMISSIBILITY AND DEPORTABILITY RELATED**
2 **TO ANIMAL CRUELTY.**

3 (a) INADMISSIBILITY.—Section 212(a)(2) of the Im-
4 migration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1182(a)(2)) is
5 amended by adding at the end the following:

6 “(J) ANIMAL CRUELTY AND ANIMAL
7 FIGHTING.—Any alien who has been convicted
8 of, who admits having committed, or who ad-
9 mits committing acts constituting the essential
10 elements of—

11 “(i) an offense under sections 48 or
12 49 of title 18, United States Code; or

13 “(ii) an offense under State, Tribal,
14 or local law, an essential element of which
15 is animal cruelty, animal abuse, or animal
16 fighting, regardless of whether such of-
17 fense is classified as a misdemeanor or fel-
18 ony under State, Tribal, or local law,
19 is inadmissible.”.

20 (b) DEPORTABILITY.—Section 237(a)(2) of the Im-
21 migration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1227(a)(2)) is
22 amended by adding at the end the following:

23 “(G) ANIMAL CRUELTY AND ANIMAL
24 FIGHTING.—Any alien who has been convicted
25 of—

1 “(i) an offense under sections 48 or
2 49 of title 18, United States Code; or

3 “(ii) an offense under State, Tribal,
4 or local law, an essential element of which
5 is animal cruelty, animal abuse, or animal
6 fighting, regardless of whether such of-
7 fense is classified as a misdemeanor or fel-
8 ony under State, Tribal, or local law,
9 is deportable.”.
