A BILL

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
 2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE; TABLE OF CONTENTS.**

1 ***TITLE I—SALES PROGRAMS***

2 ***SEC. 101. SALE OF GOVERNMENT DOCUMENTS.***

3 (a) *AUTHORITY OF SUPERINTENDENT OF DOCU-*
 4 *MENTS.—Section 1702 of title 44, United States Code, is*
 5 *amended—*

6 (1) *in the first undesignated paragraph, by*
 7 *striking “The Director” and inserting “(a) APPOINT-*
 8 *MENT.—The Director”;*

9 (2) *in the second undesignated paragraph—*

10 (A) *by striking “When an officer” and in-*
 11 *serting “(b) RECEIPT AND SALE.—When an offi-*
 12 *cer”;* and

13 (B) *by striking “who shall receive and sell”*
 14 *and inserting “who may receive and sell”; and*

15 (3) *in the third undesignated paragraph, by*
 16 *striking “The Superintendent of Documents” and in-*
 17 *serting “(c) REPORTS AND DISTRIBUTION.—The Su-*
 18 *perintendent of Documents”.*

19 (b) *REMOVE REQUIREMENT FOR APPROVAL FROM DE-*
 20 *PARTMENT IN WHICH DOCUMENT ORIGINATED.—Section*
 21 *1707 of such title is amended by striking “, subject to the*
 22 *approval of the Secretary or head of the department in*
 23 *which the public document originated”.*

24 (c) *PRICES; RESALE AUTHORITY.—Section 1708 of*
 25 *such title is amended to read as follows:*

1 **“§ 1708. Prices for sales copies of publications; cred-**
 2 **iting of receipts; resale by dealers; sales**
 3 **agents**

4 “(a) *PRICES.*—The price at which additional copies
 5 of Government publications are offered for sale to the public
 6 by the Superintendent of Documents shall be based on the
 7 cost as determined by the Director of the Government Pub-
 8 lishing Office plus a premium to cover the costs of sale and
 9 delivery. A discount may be allowed as determined by the
 10 Superintendent of Documents.

11 “(b) *RESALE AUTHORITY.*—The Superintendent of
 12 Documents may prescribe terms and conditions under
 13 which the Superintendent authorizes the resale of Govern-
 14 ment publications by book dealers, and the Superintendent
 15 may designate any Government officer as the Superintend-
 16 ent’s agent for the sale of Government publications under
 17 regulations agreed upon by the Superintendent of Docu-
 18 ments and the head of the respective department or estab-
 19 lishment of the Government.”.

20 (d) *AUTHORITY OF SUPERINTENDENT OF DOCUMENTS*
 21 *TO ESTABLISH REQUIREMENTS FOR DISTRIBUTION, SALE,*
 22 *AND DISPOSAL OF UNNEEDED DOCUMENTS.*—Section 1720
 23 of such title is amended by striking “distribution or sale”
 24 and inserting “distribution, sale, or disposal in accordance
 25 with requirements established by the Superintendent of Doc-
 26 uments”.

1 ***TITLE II—PUBLIC INFORMATION***
2 ***PROGRAMS***

3 ***SEC. 201. PURPOSE AND ESTABLISHMENT.***

4 *Chapter 19 of title 44, United States Code, is amended*
5 *by inserting before section 1901 the following new section*
6 *(and by conforming the table of sections of such chapter ac-*
7 *cordingly):*

8 ***“§ 1900. Purpose and establishment of the public in-***
9 ***formation programs of the Super-***
10 ***intendent of Documents***

11 *“(a) The purposes of this chapter are the following:*

12 *“(1) To ensure the public’s right to free, equi-*
13 *table, and convenient access to Government public in-*
14 *formation.*

15 *“(2) To establish the Public Information Pro-*
16 *grams of the Superintendent of Documents in the*
17 *Government Publishing Office, that together, function*
18 *to identify, acquire, catalog, preserve, authenticate,*
19 *disseminate, reformat, and provide no-fee permanent*
20 *public access to the corpus of Government public in-*
21 *formation for future generations, including the fol-*
22 *lowing programs and activities:*

23 *“(A) The Federal Depository Library Pro-*
24 *gram.*

1 “(B) *The Cataloging and Access Services*
2 *Program.*

3 “(C) *Online System of Access.*

4 “(D) *The National Collection of U.S. Gov-*
5 *ernment Public Information.*

6 “(E) *Preservation Program.*

7 “(F) *Sales to the Public.*

8 “(b) *The Superintendent of Documents shall engage in*
9 *activities that enhance awareness and access to Government*
10 *public information or provide services that support librar-*
11 *ies in their efforts to serve their communities.”.*

12 **SEC. 202. DEFINITIONS.**

13 *Section 1901 of title 44, United States Code, is amend-*
14 *ed to read as follows (and by conforming the table of sec-*
15 *tions of chapter 19 accordingly):*

16 **“§ 1901. Definitions**

17 *“In this chapter—*

18 *“(1) the term ‘access services’ means those func-*
19 *tions or services which enable or enhance discovery,*
20 *awareness, and use of Government public information*
21 *in the National Collection of U.S. Government Public*
22 *Information, and Federal documents collections held*
23 *by Federal depository libraries;*

24 *“(2) the term ‘Government public information’*
25 *means Federal Government publications or informa-*

1 *tion resources, regardless of physical form or medium,*
2 *compiled by Government employees, or at Government*
3 *expense, or as required by law, and disseminated to*
4 *the public by an agency or a contractor thereof or of*
5 *educational value, including such publications or in-*
6 *formation resources which have been declassified;*

7 *“(3) the term ‘Government publication’ means*
8 *informational matter which is published as an indi-*
9 *vidual document at Government expense, or as re-*
10 *quired by law;*

11 *“(4) the term ‘information’ means any commu-*
12 *nication or representation of knowledge such as facts,*
13 *data, or opinions in any medium or form, including*
14 *textual, numerical, graphic, cartographic, narrative,*
15 *electronic, or audiovisual forms;*

16 *“(5) the term ‘information lifecycle management’*
17 *means the process of planning, budgeting, admin-*
18 *istering, processing, and controlling information,*
19 *whether in the form of a tangible or digital informa-*
20 *tion asset, throughout the stages of the asset, includ-*
21 *ing the asset’s—*

22 *“(A) creation, identification, and acquisi-*
23 *tion;*

24 *“(B) organization, bibliographic control,*
25 *and metadata;*

1 “(C) preservation, digitization, and refor-
2 matting;

3 “(D) authentication, access, and dissemina-
4 tion;

5 “(E) promotion;

6 “(F) storage; and

7 “(G) management through a trusted digital
8 repository;

9 “(6) the term ‘permanent public access’ means
10 making Government public information resources dis-
11 coverable and available to, and accessible by, the pub-
12 lic on an indefinite, continuing basis, without charge;

13 “(7) the term ‘preservation’ means strategic ini-
14 tiatives, programs, and processes designed to main-
15 tain useful access to information assets, serving the
16 information needs of both present and future genera-
17 tions; and

18 “(8) the term ‘unreported public information’
19 means Government public information which is not
20 cataloged or otherwise identifiable or retrievable by
21 an end user of the catalog described in section 1917.”.

22 **SEC. 203. AVAILABILITY OF GOVERNMENT PUBLICATIONS.**

23 Section 1902 of such title is amended to read as follows
24 (and by conforming the table of sections of chapter 19 ac-
25 cordingly):

1 **“§ 1902. Availability of Government publications**
2 **through Superintendent of Documents;**
3 **notification of publications not ordered**
4 **from Government Publishing Office**

5 “(a) *AVAILABILITY.*—The Superintendent of Docu-
6 ments shall make Government public information available
7 to depository libraries through the Superintendent of Docu-
8 ments Public Information Programs.

9 “(b) *REQUIREMENTS.*—Each component of the Govern-
10 ment shall—

11 “(1) *notify the Superintendent of Documents of*
12 *tangible Government public information content it*
13 *has issued that is not also available digitally;*

14 “(2) *notify the Superintendent of Documents of*
15 *digital Government public information content it has*
16 *issued;*

17 “(3) *collaborate with the Superintendent of Docu-*
18 *ments to ensure any such digital Government public*
19 *information remains permanently accessible; and*

20 “(4) *furnish to the Superintendent of Documents*
21 *any tangible Government public information it has*
22 *issued that was obtained from sources other than the*
23 *Government Publishing Office, unless other arrange-*
24 *ments have been made with the Superintendent of*
25 *Documents to ensure the information is accessible to*
26 *depository libraries.*

1 “(c) *EXCEPTIONS.*—*The requirements of subsection (b)*
 2 *do not apply to Government public information that is con-*
 3 *fidential in character or classified for reasons of national*
 4 *security.*”.

5 **SEC. 204. SELECTIONS AVAILABLE TO DEPOSITORY LIBRAR-**
 6 **IES.**

7 *Section 1904 of such title is amended to read as follows*
 8 *(and by conforming the table of sections of chapter 19 ac-*
 9 *cordingly):*

10 **“§ 1904. Selections available to depository libraries**

11 *“The Superintendent of Documents shall notify depository*
 12 *libraries of those Government public information prod-*
 13 *ucts, regardless of format, that are available for selection*
 14 *for inclusion in their depository collections.”.*

15 **SEC. 205. DISTRIBUTION TO DEPOSITORIES.**

16 *Section 1905 of title 44, United States Code, is amend-*
 17 *ed to read as follows:*

18 **“§ 1905. Distribution to depositories; designation of**
 19 **additional libraries; justification; author-**
 20 **ization for certain designations**

21 *“(a) Government public information available from*
 22 *the Superintendent of Documents under this chapter shall*
 23 *be distributed or made accessible to depository libraries spe-*
 24 *cifically designated by law and to libraries designated pur-*
 25 *suant to this section.*

1 “(b) *Libraries within areas served by Members of the*
2 *House, Delegates, or the Resident Commissioner from the*
3 *Commonwealth of Puerto Rico may be designated by them*
4 *to receive Government public information to the extent that*
5 *the total number of libraries designated by them does not*
6 *exceed two within each area.*

7 “(c) *Not more than two additional libraries within a*
8 *State may be designated by each Senator from the State.*

9 “(d) *The Mayor of the District of Columbia may des-*
10 *ignate two depository libraries in the District of Columbia.*

11 “(e) *The Governor of the Commonwealth of Puerto*
12 *Rico, the Governor of Guam, the Governor of American*
13 *Samoa, and the Governor of the Commonwealth of the*
14 *Northern Mariana Islands may each designate one deposi-*
15 *tory library in the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, Guam,*
16 *American Samoa, and the Commonwealth of the Northern*
17 *Mariana Islands, respectively. The Governor of the United*
18 *States Virgin Islands may designate one depository library*
19 *on the island of Saint Thomas and one on the island of*
20 *Saint Croix.*

21 “(f) *The Superintendent of Documents may designate*
22 *libraries to be digital-only depository libraries for Govern-*
23 *ment public information if they are located in an area with*
24 *no vacancy under subsection (b), (c), (d), or (e) and they*
25 *are not eligible to be designated under existing by-law li-*

1 brary provisions of this section. Digital-only depository li-
 2 braries must be freely accessible to and provide services for
 3 the public and otherwise meet the requirements of this title.

4 “(g) Before a library is designated as a depository for
 5 Government public information, the Superintendent of Doc-
 6 uments shall assess the potential depository library to deter-
 7 mine its sustainability for housing a depository collection
 8 and for providing access services, including providing ac-
 9 cess to digital content. The head of that library shall furnish
 10 justification of the necessity for the additional designation
 11 to the library’s Senator, Member of the House, Delegate,
 12 Resident Commissioner from the Commonwealth of Puerto
 13 Rico, or the Mayor of the District of Columbia or Governor,
 14 as the case may be. The justification shall also include the
 15 assessment of the Superintendent of Documents. The jus-
 16 tification for depository library designations shall be trans-
 17 mitted to the Superintendent of Documents by the Senator,
 18 Member of the House, Delegate, the Resident Commissioner
 19 from the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, or the Mayor of
 20 the District of Columbia or Governor, as the case may be.”.

21 **SEC. 206. CONFORMING AMENDMENT RELATED TO LIBRAR-**

22 **IES OF EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENTS.**

23 Section 1907 of title 44, United States Code, is amend-
 24 ed—

1 (1) *in the first sentence, by striking “Govern-*
 2 *ment publications” and inserting “Government public*
 3 *information”;* and

4 (2) *in the last sentence, by striking “Library of*
 5 *Congress and the Archivist of the United States” and*
 6 *inserting “Superintendent of Documents”.*

7 **SEC. 207. REQUIREMENTS FOR DEPOSITORY LIBRARIES.**

8 *Section 1909 of title 44, United States Code, is amend-*
 9 *ed to read as follows (and by conforming the table of sec-*
 10 *tions of chapter 19 accordingly):*

11 **“§ 1909. Requirements of depository libraries; reports**
 12 ***on conditions; consultations and training;***
 13 ***termination; replacement***

14 *“(a) Only a library able to provide access to, custody*
 15 *of, and services for deposited materials or access to and*
 16 *services for online digital content and located in an area*
 17 *where it can best serve the public need may be designated*
 18 *as a depository library. The designated depository libraries*
 19 *shall report to the Superintendent of Documents at least*
 20 *every two years concerning their condition.*

21 *“(b) The Superintendent of Documents shall regularly*
 22 *assess conditions in depository libraries. The Super-*
 23 *intendent of Documents shall provide needed training and*
 24 *support by making visits to depository libraries or by other*
 25 *means and include the results of consultations in the Super-*

1 *intendent of Documents’ annual report. When the Super-*
 2 *intendent of Documents ascertains that the designated de-*
 3 *pository has ceased to be maintained so as to be accessible*
 4 *to the public, or that the Government publications which*
 5 *have been furnished the library have not been properly*
 6 *maintained, the Superintendent of Documents shall remove*
 7 *the library from the directory of depository libraries if the*
 8 *library fails to correct the unsatisfactory conditions within*
 9 *an agreed upon time frame. A library may be designated,*
 10 *pursuant to section 1905 of this chapter, to replace a li-*
 11 *brary deleted by the Superintendent of Documents, provided*
 12 *that the designation may not be in excess of the number*
 13 *of depository libraries authorized by law.”.*

14 **SEC. 208. FREE USE OF GOVERNMENT PUBLIC INFORMA-**
 15 **TION IN DEPOSITORIES.**

16 *Section 1911 of title 44, United States Code, is amend-*
 17 *ed to read as follows (and by conforming the table of sec-*
 18 *tions of chapter 19 accordingly):*

19 **“§ 1911. Free use of Government public information in**
 20 **depositories; disposal of unwanted Gov-**
 21 **ernment public information**

22 *“(a) FREE USE BY THE PUBLIC.—Depository libraries*
 23 *shall, pursuant to standards established by the Super-*
 24 *intendent of Documents, make Government public informa-*
 25 *tion accessible for free use by the public.*

1 “(b) *DIGITAL INFORMATION SUBSTITUTES.*—Deposi-
 2 *tory libraries may substitute digital information for tan-*
 3 *gible publications in accordance with Superintendent of*
 4 *Documents policy and guidance.*

5 “(c) *DISPOSAL.*—A depository library not served by a
 6 *regional depository library, or that is a regional depository*
 7 *library, may dispose of unwanted Government public infor-*
 8 *mation in accordance with Superintendent of Documents*
 9 *policy and guidance. Depository libraries may dispose of*
 10 *tangible publications which are Government property after*
 11 *retention for five years under section 1912 of this title, if*
 12 *the depository library is served by a regional depository li-*
 13 *brary.”.*

14 **SEC. 209. REGIONAL DEPOSITORIES.**

15 Section 1912 of title 44, United States Code, is amend-
 16 *ed to read as follows (and by conforming the table of sec-*
 17 *tions of chapter 19 accordingly):*

18 **“§ 1912. Regional depositories; designation; functions;**
 19 *shared responsibilities, disposal of publi-*
 20 *cations*

21 “(a) *Not more than two depository libraries in each*
 22 *State and the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico may be des-*
 23 *ignated as regional depositories and shall receive from the*
 24 *Superintendent of Documents copies of or access to all new*
 25 *and revised Government publications authorized for dis-*

1 *semination to depository libraries. Designation of regional*
2 *depository libraries may be made by a Senator or the Resi-*
3 *dent Commissioner from Puerto Rico within the areas*
4 *served by them. Prior to the designation the Superintendent*
5 *of Documents shall consult with the head of the potential*
6 *regional depository library and ascertain that the library*
7 *will fulfill the requirements for depository libraries. The*
8 *agreement to function as a regional depository library shall*
9 *be transmitted to the Superintendent of Documents by the*
10 *Senator or the Resident Commissioner from Puerto Rico*
11 *when the designation is made.*

12 “(b) *Regional depository libraries shall retain at least*
13 *one copy of all Government publications received, except*
14 *those authorized to be discarded by the Superintendent of*
15 *Documents policy and guidance or covered by collaborative*
16 *agreements approved by the Superintendent of Documents,*
17 *or make accessible digital versions (in accordance with Su-*
18 *perintendent of Documents policy) and, within the area*
19 *served, will provide leadership and coordination for the pro-*
20 *vision of program-related activities for depository libraries.*

21 “(c) *Regional depository libraries from different States*
22 *may share responsibilities by entering into agreements in*
23 *accordance with Superintendent of Documents guidance*
24 *and upon approval of a Senator from each of the States.*

1 “(d) *The Superintendent of Documents shall establish*
 2 *not fewer than four multistate collection service areas to*
 3 *support collaborative collection and service coordination*
 4 *among depository libraries within such area.*

5 “(e) *Publications distributed by the Superintendent of*
 6 *Documents to depository libraries are holdings of the Na-*
 7 *tional Collection of U.S. Government Public Information*
 8 *and remain the property of the United States Government.*
 9 *Libraries designated as regional depositories will coordi-*
 10 *nate with the Superintendent of Documents on the dispo-*
 11 *sition of Government Publications from depository libraries,*
 12 *within the areas served by them, which the depository li-*
 13 *brary has retained for five years or when the depository*
 14 *library is relinquishing its depository designation. The Su-*
 15 *perintendent of Documents shall manage the National Col-*
 16 *lection of U.S. Government Public Information to maximize*
 17 *the access to, use of, and preservation of Government public*
 18 *information in the depository library program.”.*

19 **SEC. 210. CATALOGING AND ACCESS.**

20 (a) *IN GENERAL.*—Chapter 19 of title 44, United
 21 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the following
 22 new section (and by conforming the table of sections of such
 23 chapter accordingly):

1 **“§ 1917. Cataloging and access services**

2 “(a) *CATALOGING DESCRIBED.*—*The Superintendent*
3 *of Documents shall provide descriptive cataloging records*
4 *for the corpus of Government public information. The cata-*
5 *logging records shall be created using library or information*
6 *industry standards and best practices and shall include*
7 *metadata elements in accordance with Superintendent of*
8 *Documents policy.*

9 “(b) *ACCESS AND AWARENESS SERVICES.*—*The Super-*
10 *intendent of Documents shall engage in activities that en-*
11 *hance access to and awareness of Government public infor-*
12 *mation or provide services that support libraries or organi-*
13 *zations that support libraries in their efforts to serve their*
14 *communities’ Government information needs.*

15 “(c) *SPECIFIC ACCESS SERVICES.*—

16 “(1) *The Superintendent of Documents shall*
17 *maintain an online comprehensive catalog of histor-*
18 *ical and current, tangible and digital Government*
19 *public information cataloged under subsection (a),*
20 *and such catalog shall show where the Government*
21 *public information may be obtained or accessed. The*
22 *catalog shall be machine- or device-independent and*
23 *available for free use by the public.*

24 “(2) *The Superintendent of Documents shall*
25 *carry out a program to bring unreported Government*
26 *public information under bibliographic control and to*

1 *make records associated with such information avail-*
2 *able through the catalog established by this section*
3 *and such other methods as may be appropriate.*

4 “(3) *The Superintendent of Documents may*
5 *make the records of such catalog available to Federal*
6 *depository libraries, bibliographic utilities that sup-*
7 *port widely available record sharing, or other entities*
8 *that make available Government public information.*

9 “(4) *The Superintendent of Documents may ac-*
10 *cept records for inclusion in such catalog from librar-*
11 *ies and agencies of the Federal Government, Federal*
12 *depository libraries, bibliographic utilities that sup-*
13 *port widely available record sharing, or other entities*
14 *that make available Government public information.*

15 “(5) *The Superintendent of Documents may ac-*
16 *quire digital Government public information for in-*
17 *clusion in the Cataloging and Access Services Pro-*
18 *gram, Federal Depository Library Program, and*
19 *GPO’s System of Online Access through automated*
20 *and manual harvesting of public websites. Such con-*
21 *tent will be cataloged, made accessible through the*
22 *catalog established under this subsection, and pre-*
23 *served.”.*

24 (b) *CONFORMING AMENDMENTS.—Chapter 17 of such*
25 *title is amended by repealing sections 1710 and 1711 (and*

1 *by conforming the table of sections of such chapter accord-*
 2 *ingly).*

3 **SEC. 211. NATIONAL COLLECTION OF UNITED STATES PUB-**
 4 **LIC INFORMATION.**

5 *(a) IN GENERAL.—Chapter 19 of title 44, United*
 6 *States Code, is amended by adding at the end the following*
 7 *new section (and by conforming the table of sections of such*
 8 *chapter accordingly):*

9 **“§ 1918. National Collection of United States Public**
 10 **Information**

11 *“(a) ESTABLISHMENT AND PURPOSE.—*

12 *“(1) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is hereby estab-*
 13 *lished a National Collection of United States Govern-*
 14 *ment Public Information (referred to in this chapter*
 15 *as the ‘National Collection’).*

16 *“(2) PURPOSE.—The Federal Government’s pub-*
 17 *lications and information are national assets and re-*
 18 *sources. Their availability and accessibility ensures*
