## A BILL

To amend the Small Business Act to include requirements relating to apprenticeship program assistance for small business development centers, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Small Business Work-  
5 force Pipeline Act of 2026”.

6 **SEC. 2. SMALL BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT CENTER APPREN-**  
7 **TICESHIP PROGRAM ASSISTANCE.**

8 Section 21(c)(3) of the Small Business Act (15  
9 U.S.C. 648(c)(3)) is amended—

1           (1) in subparagraph (T), by striking “and” at  
2 the end;

3           (2) in clause (v) of the first subparagraph (U)  
4 (relating to succession planning), by striking the pe-  
5 riod at the end and inserting a semicolon;

6           (3) by redesignating the second subparagraph  
7 (U) (relating to training on domestic and inter-  
8 national intellectual property protections) as sub-  
9 paragraph (V);

10          (4) in subparagraph (V)(ii)(II), as so redesi-  
11 gnated, by striking the period at the end and insert-  
12 ing “; and”; and

13          (5) by adding at the end the following:

14           “(W) providing information and assistance to  
15 small business concerns, including by disseminating  
16 relevant information from the Department of Labor  
17 and other Federal agencies, on how to establish and  
18 improve—

19           “(i) opportunities for work-based learning,  
20 as defined in section 3 of the Carl D. Perkins  
21 Career and Technical Education Act of 2006  
22 (20 U.S.C. 2302);

23           “(ii) apprenticeship programs registered  
24 under the Act of August 16, 1937 (commonly  
25 known as the ‘National Apprenticeship Act’)

1 (50 Stat. 664, chapter 663; 29 U.S.C. 50 et  
2 seq.);

3 “(iii) pre-apprenticeship programs; and

4 “(iv) job training programs.”.
