Mr. CORNYN (for himself and Mr. CASSIDY) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources

A BILL

To abolish and defund the César E. Chávez National Monument in the State of California, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “No Funding to Honor
5 Crime Scenes Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. ABOLISHMENT AND DEFUNDING OF CÉSAR E.**
7 **CHÁVEZ NATIONAL MONUMENT.**

8 (a) ABOLISHMENT.—The César E. Chávez National
9 Monument established in the State of California by Presi-
10 dential Proclamation 8884, as issued on October 8, 2012

1 (54 U.S.C. 320301 note) (referred to in this section as
2 the “César E. Chávez National Monument”), is abolished.

3 (b) DEFUNDING; TRANSFER.—On the abolishment of
4 the César E. Chávez National Monument under subsection
5 (a), any unobligated amounts previously appropriated or
6 otherwise made available for the César E. Chávez National
7 Monument—

8 (1) may not be used by the Secretary of the In-
9 terior to support the operation or maintenance of
10 the César E. Chávez National Monument, except to
11 conduct necessary actions to carry out that sub-
12 section; and

13 (2) shall be transferred and made available to
14 carry out section 2 of the DNA Analysis Backlog
15 Elimination Act of 2000 (34 U.S.C. 40701).

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
