The Senate has provided only $\$ 90 \mathrm{mil}-$ lion which would be a cut of $\$ 10 \mathrm{milli}$ ion below last year's spending level and would be a setback to UNICEF's ability to make progress against childhood disease and hunger.
I know that the gentleman from Alabama [Mr. CaLLAhan], the chairman of the subcommittee, feels strongly about UNICEF and is prepared to accept this motion.
