MAKING IN ORDER AT ANY TIME ON JULY 18, 2000, OR ANY DAY THEREAFTER, CONSIDERATION OF H.J. RES. 103, AUTHORIZING EXTENSION NONDISCRIM-OF INATORY TREATMENT (NORMAL TRADE RELATIONS TREATMENT) PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC CHINA

Mr. DREIER. Mr. Speaker, I ask unanimous consent that it be in order at any time on July 18 of 2000, or any day thereafter, to consider in the House the joint resolution (H.J. Res. 103) disapproving the extension of the waiver authority contained in section 402(c) of the Trade Act of 1974 with respect to the People's Republic of China; that the joint resolution be considered as read for amendment; that all points of order against the joint resolution and against its consideration waived; that the joint resolution be debatable for 2 hours equally divided and controlled by the Chairman of the Committee on Ways and Means, in opposition of the joint resolution, and a Member in support of the joint resolution; that pursuant to section 152 and 153 of the Trade Act of 1974, the previous question be considered as ordered on the joint resolution to final passage without intervening motion; and that the provision of section 152 and 153 of the Trade Act of 1974 shall not otherwise apply to any joint resolution disapproving the extension of the waiver authority contained in section 402(c) of the Trade Act of 1974 with respect to the People's Republic of China for the remainder of the second session of the 106th Congress.

Mr. Speaker, let me say that it is the intention of this unanimous consent request that the 2 hours of debate be yielded fairly between Members of the majority and the minority parties on both sides of this issue.
