THE PRESIDENT'S POLICIES ARE NOT WORKING

Mr. BROWN of Ohio. Madam Speaker, the numbers are out again. Ohio and most of the rest of the country continue to lose manufacturing jobs. One out of six manufacturing jobs in my State has disappeared since President Bush took office.
