## RENEWABLE ENERGY PROJECT SITING IMPROVEMENT ACT OF 2004

Mr. POMBO. Mr. Speaker, pursuant to House Resolution 672. I call up the bill (H.R. 4513) to provide that in preparing an environmental assessment or environmental impact statement re-quired under section 102 of the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 with respect to any action authorizing a renewable energy project, no Federal agency is required to identify alternative project locations or actions other than the proposed action and the no action alternative, and for other purposes.

The Clerk read the title of the bill.

The SPEAKER pro tempore. Pursuant to House Resolution 672, the bill is considered read for amendment.

The text of H.R. 4513 is as follows:

#### H.R. 4513

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

#### SECTION 1. ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW FOR RE-NEWABLE ENERGY PROJECTS.

(a) COMPLIANCE WITH NEPA FOR RENEW-ABLE ENERGY PROJECTS.—Notwithstanding any other law, in preparing an environmental assessment or environmental impact statement required under section 102 of the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (42 U.S.C. 4332) with respect to any action authorizing a renewable energy project under the jurisdiction of a Federal agency-

(1) no Federal agency is required to identify alternative project locations or actions other than the proposed action and the no action alternative; and

(2) no Federal agency is required to analyze the environmental effects of alternative locations or actions other than those submitted by the project proponent.

(b) CONSIDERATION OF ALTERNATIVES .- In any environmental assessment or environmental impact statement referred to in subsection (a), the Federal agency shall only identify and analyze the environmental effects and potential mitigation measures of-(1) the proposed action; and
