Mr. Speaker, I wish to announce to all Members of the House that the conference report to accompany H.R. 2082, the Intelligence Authorization Act of Fiscal Year 2008, has been filed in accordance with House rules and that the classified schedule of authorizations and the classified annex of the conference report is available for review by Members at the offices of the Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence in room H-405 of the Capitol. The committee office is open during regular business hours, and this evening during our votes, for the convenience of any Member who wishes to review this material prior to the consideration of the conference report by the House. Members wishing to review this material should contact the committee to arrange a time and a date for that review.

In addition to signing the oath for access to classified information specified in clause 13 of rule XXIII of the House of Representatives Rules, committee rules also require that Members agree in writing to a nondisclosure agreement that indicates that the Member has been granted access to the classified schedule of authorizations and classified annex, and that they are familiar with the rules of the House and the committee with respect to the classified nature of that information and the limitations on disclosure of such information.
