

UNANIMOUS-CONSENT AGREEMENT—EXECUTIVE CALENDAR

Mr. BROWN. I ask unanimous consent that notwithstanding the provisions of rule XXII, when the Senate completes its action on S. 1082, it proceed to executive session to consider Calendar No. 104, Debra Ann Livingston to be U.S. circuit judge; that there be 3 hours for debate equally divided between the chairman and the ranking member of the Judiciary Committee or their designees; that upon the use or yielding back of time the Senate, without any intervening action, vote on the nomination; that the motion to reconsider be laid on the table, the President be immediately notified of the Senate's action, and the Senate then return to legislative session.

A concurrent resolution (H. Con. Res. 124) authorizing the use of the Capitol grounds on May 15, 2007, for the Peace Officers' Memorial Service.
