For an additional amount for "Grants-inAid for Airports", to enable the Secretary of Transportation to make discretionary grants as authorized by subchapter I of chapter 471 and subchapter I of chapter 475 of title 49 , United States Code, $\$ 600,000,000$, to be derived from the Airport and Airway Trust Fund and to remain available until September 30, 2009: Provided, That in selecting projects to be funded, priority shall be given to airport projects that can award contracts based on bids within 120 days of enactment of this Act.

HIGHWAY INFRASTRUCTURE INVESTMENT
