JOB LOSSES CONTINUE IN AS DEMOCRATS CONTINUE APRIL, TO WORK TO STIMULATE THE **ECONOMY**

Mr. PALLONE. Madam Speaker, as the first quarter of 2008 ended, it was clear that things are not getting any better for American families struggling to make ends meet. All of these red flags show why it is so important that we worked together in a bipartisan fashion earlier this year to pass the economic stimulus package. As a result of that action, 150 million began receiving rebate taxpavers checks last week. That was a good start, but more needs to be done.

Madam Speaker, with so many Americans struggling and the bad economic news continuing to mount, we urge the President and the Republicans to join us to pass a second economic stimulus package.
