TEMPORARY EXTENSION OF FARM PROGRAMS

Mr. PETERSON of Minnesota. H.R. 6051

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled.

SECTION 1. ADDITIONAL TEMPORARY EXTEN-SION OF AGRICULTURAL PROGRAMS AND SUSPENSION OF PERMANENT PRICE SUPPORT AUTHORITIES.

Effective May 16, 2008, section 1 of Public Law 110–196 (122 Stat. 653) (as amended by Public Law 110–200 (122 Stat. 695), Public Law 110-205 (122 Stat. 713), and Public Law 110-208 (122 Stat. 720)) is amended—

(1) in subsection (a), by striking "May 16, 2008" and inserting "the earlier of May 23, 2008, or the date of the enactment of the Food, Conservation, and Energy Act of 2008"; and

(2) in subsection (d), by striking "May 16, 2008" and inserting "the earlier of May 23, 2008, or the date of the enactment of the Food, Conservation, and Energy Act of 2008".
