REPORT ON RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR CONSIDERATION OF H.R. 6842, NATIONAL CAPITAL SECURITY AND SAFETY ACT

Mr. McGOVERN, from the Committee on Rules, submitted a privileged report (Rept. No. 110-852) on the resolution (H. Res. 1434) providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 6842) to require the District of Columbia to revise its laws regarding the use and possession of firearms as necessary to comply with the requirements of the decision of the Supreme Court in the case of District of Columbia v. Heller, in a manner that protects the security interests of the Federal government
