Committee Chair and Appropriations Committee members return to regular order and fiercely protect the prerogatives of this great committee.

Mr. CAMPBELL of California. Mr. Speaker, today the House of Representatives voted on legislation (H.R. 2638, the Consolidated Security, Disaster Assistance, and Continuing Appropriations Act of 2009) to fund government operations through March 6th of next year. The legislation contained a provision to provide up to \$25 billion in loan guarantees to companies that engage in the manufacturing and distribution of automobiles and trucks. Although I was advised by the House Committee on Ethics and Standards that I had no ethical conflict under the rules relative to this provision, I believe that I do have a conflict. A company which I control derives substantial income through real property leases to one of the auto companies that may receive loan guarantees under this bill. Therefore, I felt it would be improper for me to vote on or to engage in any debate or discussion on this bill. Accordingly, I voted "Present" on H.R. 2638.

# ALTERNATIVE MINIMUM TAX RELIEF ACT OF 2008

Mr. NEAL of Massachusetts. Madam Speaker, I move to suspend the rules and pass the bill (H.R. 7005) to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to provide alternative minimum tax relief for individuals for 2008.

The Clerk read the title of the bill. The text of the bill is as follows:

#### H.R. 7005

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled.

#### SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE, ETC.

- (a) IN GENERAL.—This Act may be cited as the "Alternative Minimum Tax Relief Act of 2008"
- (b) REFERENCE.—Except as otherwise expressly provided, whenever in this Act an amendment or repeal is expressed in terms of an amendment to, or repeal of, a section or other provision, the reference shall be considered to be made to a section or other provision of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986.

#### SEC. 2. EXTENSION OF ALTERNATIVE MINIMUM TAX RELIEF FOR NONREFUNDABLE PERSONAL CREDITS.

- (a) IN GENERAL.—Paragraph (2) of section 26(a) is amended-
- (1) by striking "or 2007" and inserting "2007, or 2008", and
- (2) by striking "2007" in the heading thereof and inserting "2008"
- (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by this section shall apply to taxable years beginning after December 31, 2007.

#### SEC. 3. EXTENSION OF INCREASED ALTERNATIVE MINIMUM TAX EXEMPTION AMOUNT.

- (a) IN GENERAL.—Paragraph (1) of section 55(d) is amended—
- (1) by striking "(\$66,250 in the case of taxable years beginning in 2007)" in subparagraph (A) and inserting "(\$69,950 in the case of taxable years beginning in 2008)", and
- (2) by striking "(\$44,350 in the case of taxable years beginning in 2007)" in subparagraph (B) and inserting "(\$46,200 in the case of taxable years beginning in 2008)".
  (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments
- made by this section shall apply to taxable years beginning after December 31, 2007.

# SEC. 4. INCREASE OF AMT REFUNDABLE CREDIT AMOUNT FOR INDIVIDUALS WITH LONG-TERM UNUSED CREDITS FOR PRIOR YEAR MINIMUM TAX LIABIL-ITY, ETC.

- (a) IN GENERAL.—Paragraph (2) of section 53(e) is amended to read as follows:
- "(2) AMT REFUNDABLE CREDIT AMOUNT.— For purposes of paragraph (1), the term 'AMT refundable credit amount' means, with respect to any taxable year, the amount (not in excess of the long-term unused minimum tax credit for such taxable year) equal to the greater of-
- "(A) 50 percent of the long-term unused minimum tax credit for such taxable year, or
- "(B) the amount (if any) of the AMT refundable credit amount for the taxpayer's preceding taxable year (determined without regard to subsection (f)(2))."
- (b) TREATMENT OF CERTAIN UNDERPAY-MENTS, INTEREST, AND PENALTIES ATTRIB-UTABLE TO THE TREATMENT OF INCENTIVE STOCK OPTIONS.—Section 53 is amended by adding at the end the following new subsection:
- "(f) TREATMENT OF CERTAIN UNDERPAY-MENTS, INTEREST, AND PENALTIES ATTRIB-UTABLE TO THE TREATMENT OF INCENTIVE STOCK OPTIONS.
