Pursuant to House Resolution 1203, it is now in order to debate the topics addressed by the Senate amendments to the bill (H.R. 3590) to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to modify the first-time homebuyers credit in the case of members of the Armed Forces and certain other Federal employees, and for other purposes, and the topics addressed by the bill (H.R. 4872) to provide for reconciliation pursuant to section 202 of the concurrent resolution on the budget for fiscal year 2010.

The gentleman from Maryland (Mr. HOYER) and the gentleman from Ohio (Mr. BOEHNER), or their designees, each will control 60 minutes.

The Chair recognizes the gentleman from California (Mr. WAXMAN) for 15 minutes as a designee of the majority leader.
