## MOMENT OF SILENCE FOR VICTIMS OF

 CLACKAMAS MALL SHOOTINGMr. BLUMENAUER. Mr. Speaker, yesterday afternoon, in my district at the Clackamas Town Center, a masked gunman with a stolen semi-automatic rifle discharged some 60 shots. He killed two people, wounded a 15-yearold girl, and then took his own life.
