Madam Speaker, the House will consider a number of suspensions next week, a complete list of which will be announced by close of business today.

The House will consider H.R. 5053, the Preventing the IRS Abuse and Protecting Free Speech Act, sponsored by Representative ROSKAM. This commonsense bill prohibits the IRS from collecting donor information, which has been used by the IRS to improperly target tax-exempt organizations.

Finally, Madam Speaker, the House will consider H.R. 5293, the FY17 Defense appropriations bill, sponsored by RODNEY Representative FRELING-HUYSEN.
